The above Order, made on 6th December 2023, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:-

Former Alnwick District

Restricted Byway No 29 / Footpath No 15 (Parish of Whittingham)

Adding thereto a restricted byway, from the southern end of alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 30, at the boundary of Thrunton Wood, 510 metres south-east of the former Whittonlea Quarry (O.S. Grid Ref NU 0678 1033), in a general easterly direction for a distance of 295 metres to a point on existing Public Footpath No 15, 650 metres south-east of Whittonlea Quarry (NU 0707 1040).

And upgrading to restricted byway status (and renumbering) part of existing Public Footpath No 15, from a point 650 metres south-east of Whittonlea Quarry (O.S. Grid Ref NU 0707 1040), in an easterly direction for a distance of 1160 metres, to join Byway Open to All Traffic No 24, at the north-east corner of Thrunton Wood (NU 0818 1043).

Byway Open to All Traffic No 30 (Parish of Whittingham)

Adding thereto a byway open to all traffic, from the C178 road, 100 metres south of the former Whittonlea Quarry (O.S. Grid Ref NU 0650 1067), in a general easterly then southerly direction along the U4063 road for a distance of 550 metres, to the western end of alleged Restricted Byway No 29, at the boundary of Thrunton Wood, 510 metres south-east of the former Whittonlea Quarry (NU 0678 1033).
