# Virtual School Headteacher's Annual Report 2016-17

### **Revised guidance**

- As you know the revised statutory guidance for local authority Virtual Schools and Designated
  Teachers of looked after and previously looked after children has been published. The training
  events we held this half term to introduce the key points and changes to you were well attended
  and the feedback was very positive.

- Two questions in particular are being frequently asked:

Question: Are children who leave care and return home then known as previously looked after? Answer: No, only children who leave local authority care on an order are then known as previously looked after. The order can be for adoption, special guardianship, child arrangements or residence.

Question: Does the Admissions Code apply to previously looked after children?

Answer: Yes it does. A previously looked after child is considered to be 'ever-LAC' with regard to the Regulations made under the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 which requires admission authorities for maintained schools to give looked after children highest priority in their admission arrangements. The School Admissions Code places this same requirement on academies. These provisions help ensure that looked-after and previously looked after children obtain a place at their preferred schools. Such children must take precedence over those on a waiting list and cannot be refused a place because of having challenging behaviour.

#### **Designated Teacher Training Programme**

 Achievement for All is working with us to establish a Designated Teacher Training Hub in Northumberland. ## **Pupil Premium Plus**

- For this financial year the Pupil Premium Plus rate is £2 300 and there will be no change this year to the way we distribute the funding or the amount retained by the Virtual School. You should therefore expect to receive £1900 of each £2300 grant for every eligible pupil on roll at your school, and the Virtual School will retain £400 of each grant to fund strategies and interventions which will benefit all looked after and previously looked after children eg the Virtual School Education Psychologist, Achievement for All and Thrive attachment training.
- In accordance with statutory requirements Northumberland Virtual School has a Pupil Premium Plus Policy. The policy has been updated to reflect the changes and is available on the <u>Virtual School page</u> of the Council's website.
- Dispersal of the grant is dependent on schools completing the Pupil Premium Plus agreement in each child's ePEP to evidence that outcomes have been agreed following an assessment of educational need, and that progress is monitored to show the impact of the Pupil Premium Plus. The Designated Teacher in every school/academy should therefore ensure that every looked after child has a good ePEP in place, which is also a requirement of the revised statutory guidance.

#### **ePEP**

- The implementation of Northumberland's ePEP will be complete by the end of term. By then all Designated Teachers will be able to access the ePEP of each child on their school roll to update or view as appropriate. You will also be able to download the ePEP to print a hard copy.

- The developer of the ePEP Seven365 has demonstrated to the Virtual School how the
