You will see from the Information Leaflet that one of our local priorities for 2015-16 is *improving* partnership working with education services on the safeguarding agenda. In September 2015 a new Education Reference Group for the NSCB was convened. A representative from each education partnership, each phase and each type of education settings met alongside agency partners including the Police, Health and Local Authority. The Group is Chaired by Jane Walker, Senior Manager in the Education Service and Headteacher of the Virtual School for Looked After Children. Terms of Reference were agreed and a workplan is being drafted to fulfil its purpose which is:

- to develop a framework to support a new relationship between education settings and the LSCB:
- for education settings to use that framework to support each other as peers;
- to develop and implement a safeguarding assurance and improvement framework for education settings in order to:
 - o improve the welfare and safety of children and young people (through the delivery of training audit processes and education improvement offer)
 - o provide assurance for establishments and the LSCB of the effectiveness of safeguarding arrangements and practice (through the s175, s157 audit process, external inspections and reviews)
- provide peer support to Headteachers and Further Education representatives on the LSCB to ensure that:
 - the LSCB is aware of key safeguarding issues and challenges faced by educational establishments
 - o emerging safeguarding issues are communicated effectively to all educational establishments
 - o the representatives challenge the LSCB and vice versa.

You will all be kept up to date and invited to participate through this bulletin and your partnership or setting representative.

Safeguarding Standards :

Section 175/11

The Safeguarding Standards audit tool - Section 175/11 - is being amended as a result of your feedback and in response to national developments. The revised template will be made available to you electronically through the Virtual College hopefully before the end of term for completion before Easter 2016. Ofsted Common Inspection Framework and Safeguarding

The new Ofsted Common Inspection Framework has raised the profile of safeguarding. HMI David Brown highlighted the following to Headteachers at a Northumberland conference on Friday 18th September 2015:

- Inspectors will make two judgements on short inspections: is the school continuing to be a good school? Is safeguarding effective? If more evidence is needed to reach a decision, or there is evidence of improvement/decline, it will be converted to a section 5 inspection.
- Safeguarding and promoting thei welfare of children and young people is defined in <u>Working Together</u> to Safeguarding Children
- <u>Inspecting safeguarding</u> will include action taken or needed to protect children and learners from bullying, on-line bullying, prejudice-based bullying, the impact of new technologies and online safety.
- Inspectors will therefore look for signs of successful safeguarding arrangements and how effectively leaders create a safeguarding culture.
- In order to make a judgement about the extent to which the provision is successfully promoting and supporting children's and learners' safety inspectors will consider the children's and learners' own understanding of how to keep themselves safe from relevant risks such as exploitation and extremism.
