Education Reference Group: LSCB

Education is currently one of the priorities of Northumberland's Local Safeguarding Children's Board (LSCB). An Education Reference sub-group has therefore been convened with representation from all learning partnerships across all phases. The group has now met twice and has agreed Terms of Reference and an initial workplan.

The purpose of the Education Reference Group is:

- to develop a framework to support a new relationship between education settings and the LSCB;
- for education settings to use that framework to support each other as peers;
- to develop and implement a safeguarding assurance and improvement framework for education settings in order to:
 - improve the welfare and safety of children and young people (through the delivery of training audit processes and education improvement offer)
 - provide assurance for establishments and the LSCB of the effectiveness of safeguarding arrangements and practice (through the s175, s157 audit process, external inspections and reviews)
- provide peer support to Headteachers and Further Education representatives on the LSCB to ensure that:
 - the LSCB is aware of key safeguarding issues and challenges faced by educational establishments
 - emerging safeguarding issues are communicated effectively to all educational establishments
 - the representatives challenge the LSCB and vice versa.

The aims of the agreed work plan, which is still in draft form, are to:

- consider, scope, and further research key issues and developments relating to safeguarding standards in schools;
- prepare schools for external scrutiny, including from Ofsted;
- effectively disseminate to education settings learning which emerges from management and serious case reviews;
- provide the Board with a rigorous and effective review of safeguarding practice in education settings;
- maintain, review and produce up to date policies and procedures for education settings;
- promote accessibility to and awareness of information and resources that help to keep children safe and protected in education settings;
- provide a forum where professionals from across agencies and education settings can coordinate and collaborate on strategic plans designed to keep children safe;
- in conjunction with the Business Sub-Committee and other sub committees ensure that activity and outcomes cross reference and complement each other.

Actions will involve developing a local model policy with good practice guidance for the use of physical restraint in education settings, improve understanding of the interface between the Early Help offer and social care services, support the implementation of Early Help hubs in each locality, improve awareness of the Self Harm and Suicide Pathway, and developing the role of the Designated Safeguarding Lead.

This is not a definitive list and the group welcomes contributions from all professionals involved in education across the County. If you want to get involved then please contact your partnership representative or Carol Leckie.

10 things you need to know about Safeguarding

1. The Ofsted definition for safeguarding is:
 - protecting children from maltreatment
 - preventing impairment of children's health or development
 - ensuring that children are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care
 - taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.
2. Make sure you have read ***Keeping Children Safe in Education, July 2015***. Reading part one is a statutory requirement for all school staff. The full document will keep your knowledge up to date.

This document will be updated annually (for the start of each academic year) and we will keep you informed of changes.
3. Ensure you are clear about procedures for referrals. If you have any concerns about a young person then: **RESPOND – REPORT – RECORD**
4. If you have any safeguarding concerns **you must also report** them to your DSL who will advise you on the appropriate course of action. And you should ask your DSL for a progress update to ensure your concerns have been actioned.

6. Following a series of malicious hoax communications to schools across the UK it is important that you are alert, but not alarmed. The National Counter Terrorism Security Office has issued guidance for schools as an opportunity for you to review your security plans to confirm that the arrangements you should already have in place are still current and have been tested to ensure staff and students are prepared and confident. 7. If you have any concerns about the behaviour of an adult in school you must contact the Local Authority Designated Officer (LADO).

8. The new OFSTED safeguarding guidance [Inspecting Safeguarding in Early Years, Education and Skills Settings. Guidance for inspectors undertaking inspection under the common inspection framework, August 2015](#) gives schools clear guidance on what the inspectors will look for - they want to know a school's safeguarding practice is effective and that they are providing a safe learning environment.
9. Ensure the your safeguarding training is up to date, not just the basic awareness of what abuse looks like but an understanding of current agendas such as Prevent, Child Sexual Exploitation, Female Genital Mutilation.
10. The LSCB's Suicide and Self Harm Pathway and Thresholds documents have both recently been updated and can be viewed at the link at number 5. Further consultation will be taking place with partner agencies, including schools and education settings, through the Education Reference sub-group.

Operation Encompass



In brief, Operation Encompass is a protocol whereby the Police inform schools when they have been to a home when there has been a call regarding domestic abuse. The pilot has been very successful in other Northumbria area commands and there is now a plan to extend this into the Northumberland Area Command.
