About: The Northumbrian Ranters was formed in 2006 and has an average membership of 40 students from across the whole of Northumberland. They have represented the county at venues in England, Scotland and America and continue to be a very popular ensemble.

Alongside instrumental performances, students sing and demonstrate traditional Northumbrian clog dancing. The Ranters fulfil a very important role in keeping our traditional musical heritage alive, especially with the younger generation
