Background:

Northumberland Education Business Partnership (NEBP) has extensive experience in bringing together schools, businesses and other relevant parties to offer an effective range of mutually beneficial work related learning activities that support children and young people to develop employability and enterprise skills and make realistic but ambitious plans for their future.

These interventions raise achievement and aspiration; support progression and decision making, and develop employability skills to help young people to be 'work ready'.

Additionally the activities on offer can support the enhancement of the National Curriculum with emphasis upon Work Related Learning and Enterprise Education.

NEBP is supported in its delivery by:

Business Ambassadors who are trained employers / employees who work with pupils on EBP activities to help prepare them to be 'work ready', to give them a better understanding of the world of work and to raise job awareness and;

Apprentice Ambassadors who are real life apprentices who will share their personal career journey to enable pupils to gain a better understanding of the routes into and the reality of apprenticeships.

Why this is important

Department for Education guidance¹ suggests that schools and academies should consider a range of wider careers activities to offer all young people insights into the world of work. NEBPs local **employer engagement** enables schools to access a high quality range of work-related activities to enhance their **careers offer**.

Having the opportunity to talk to people in those jobs and visit workplaces helps to build knowledge and understanding of the full range of careers available in a particular sector."²

*Pupil visits to industry

Pupils benefit from 'real life' experiences in a range of businesses and sectors.

Employer Engagement

Involvement and input by employers for groups of pupils working on 'big picture' topics such as sustainable energy and the environment.

Build A Business⁴

To enable pupils to consider self-employment as a potential career option. Team work activities supported by local self-employed role models and Business Ambassadors enable pupils to form their own business and develop a new product idea.

Apprentice Ambassadors

Presentation from a current Apprentice. The Ambassador will describe their own personal journey from leaving school to the current time, and will include details of their job and the work they do, the business they work for, the training involved and their aspirations upon completion of their Apprenticeships. Can be tailored to Apprenticeships in a specific sector if required.

*Career Speed Dating

This event raises sector and job awareness. It allows the young person to meet and 'grill' employees about their successful route into their career and to understand the qualifications and attributes needed. There will be an opportunity for young people to meet **Apprentice Ambassadors**.

Employer support for Work Related Learning and Enterprise activities

Activities such as developing teamwork, problem solving and communication and employability skills involving a work related and enterprise dimension in partnership with local employers.
