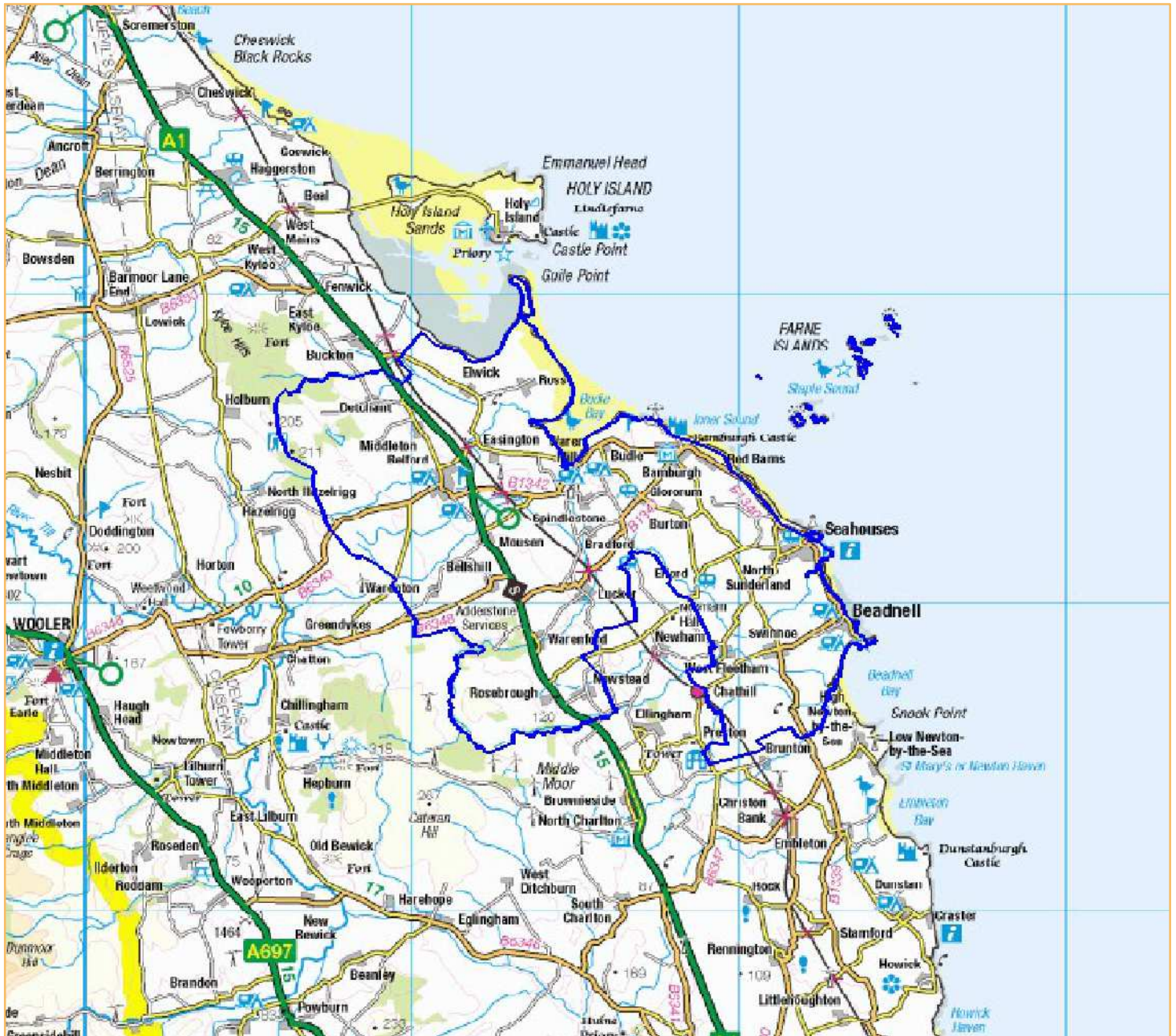

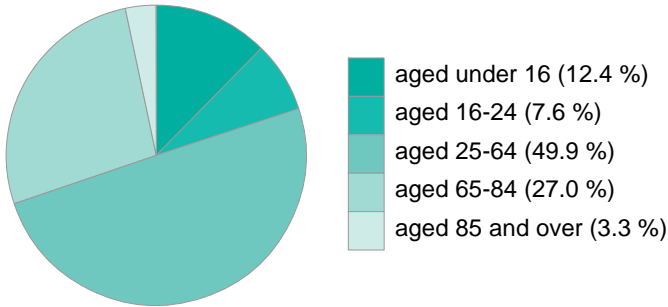

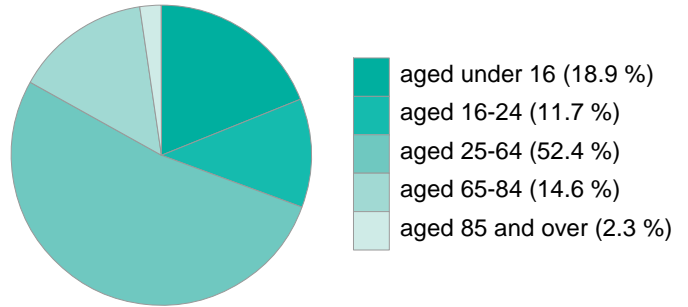

Population by age group, 2012 England



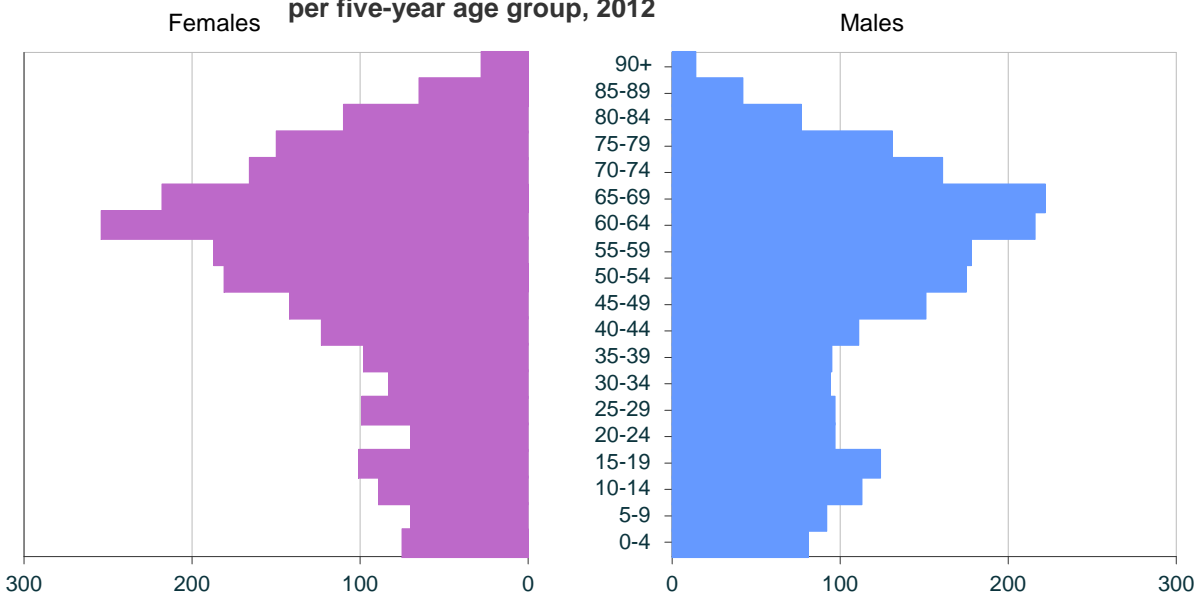

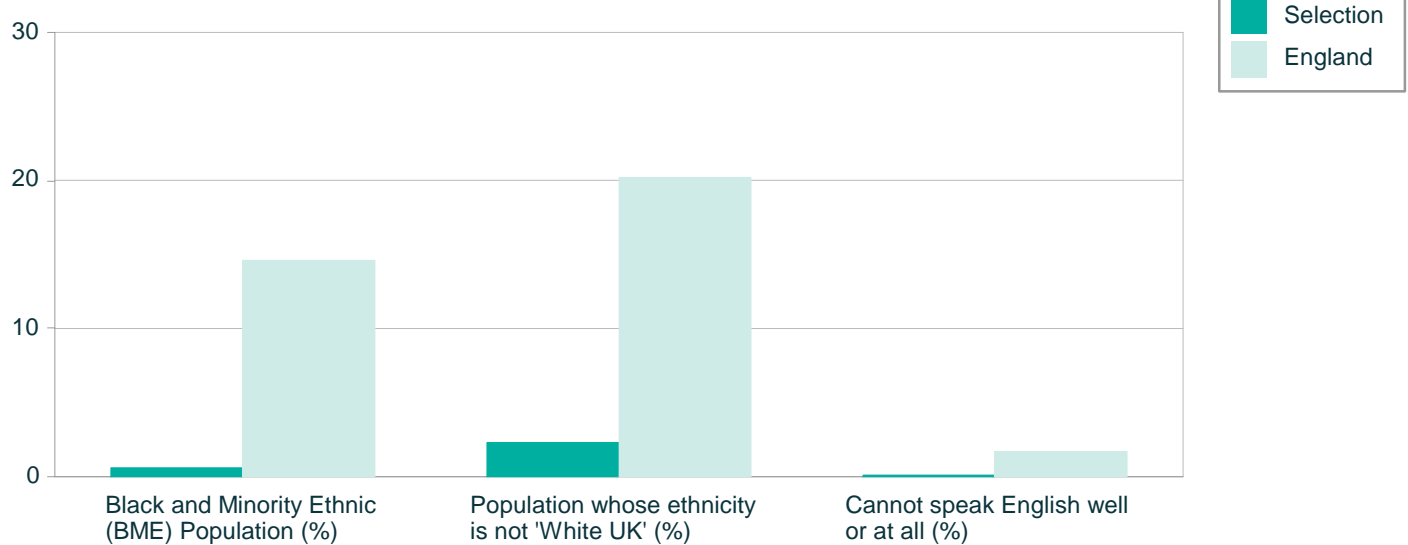

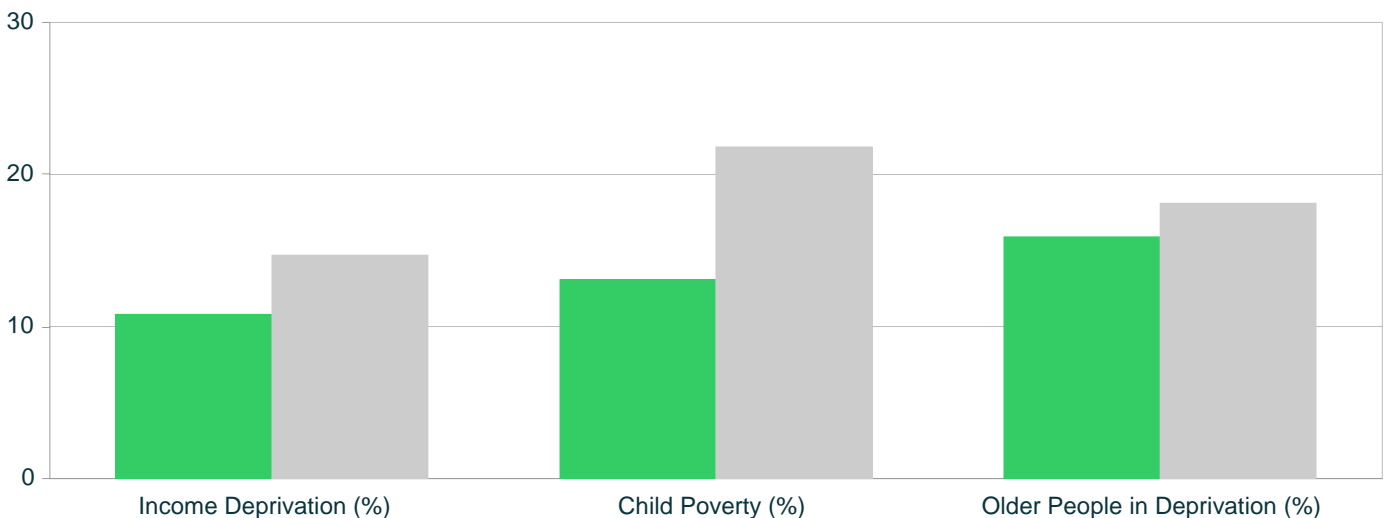

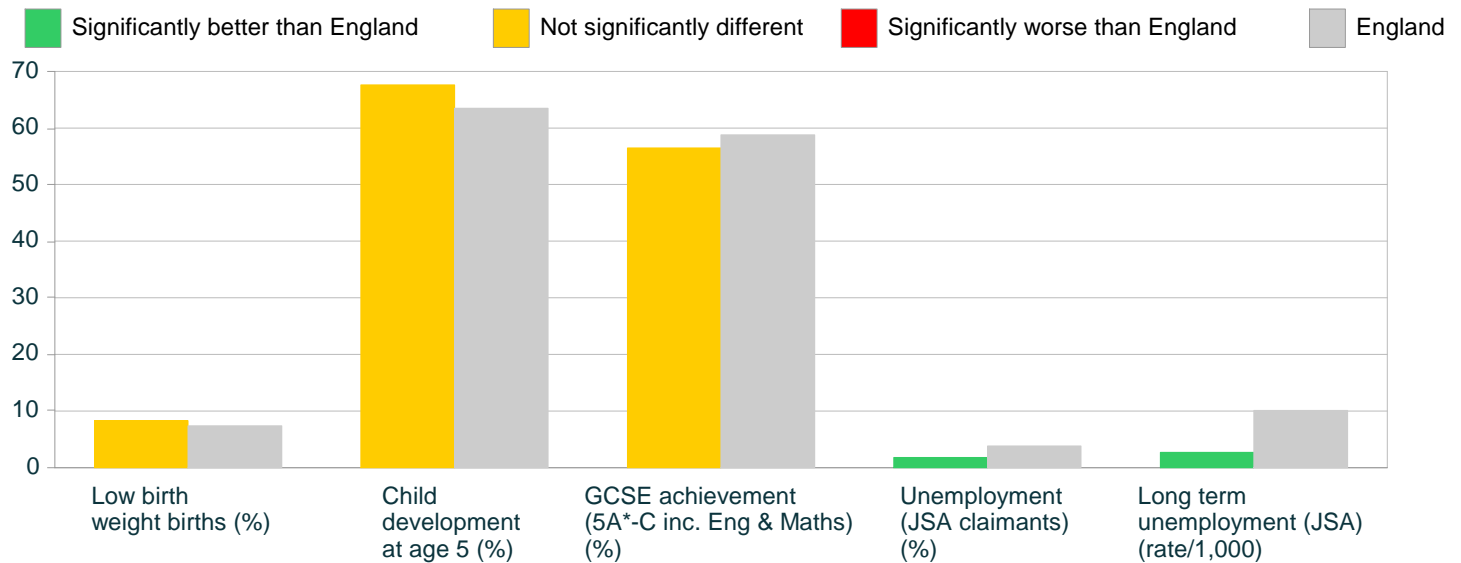

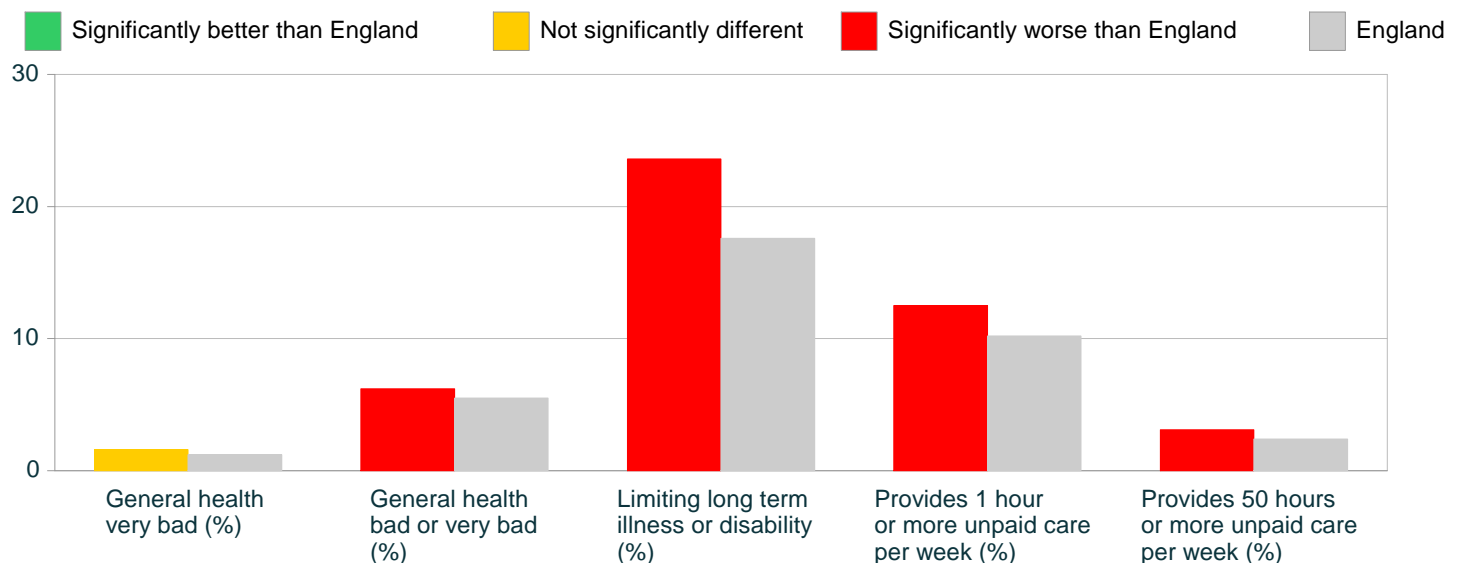

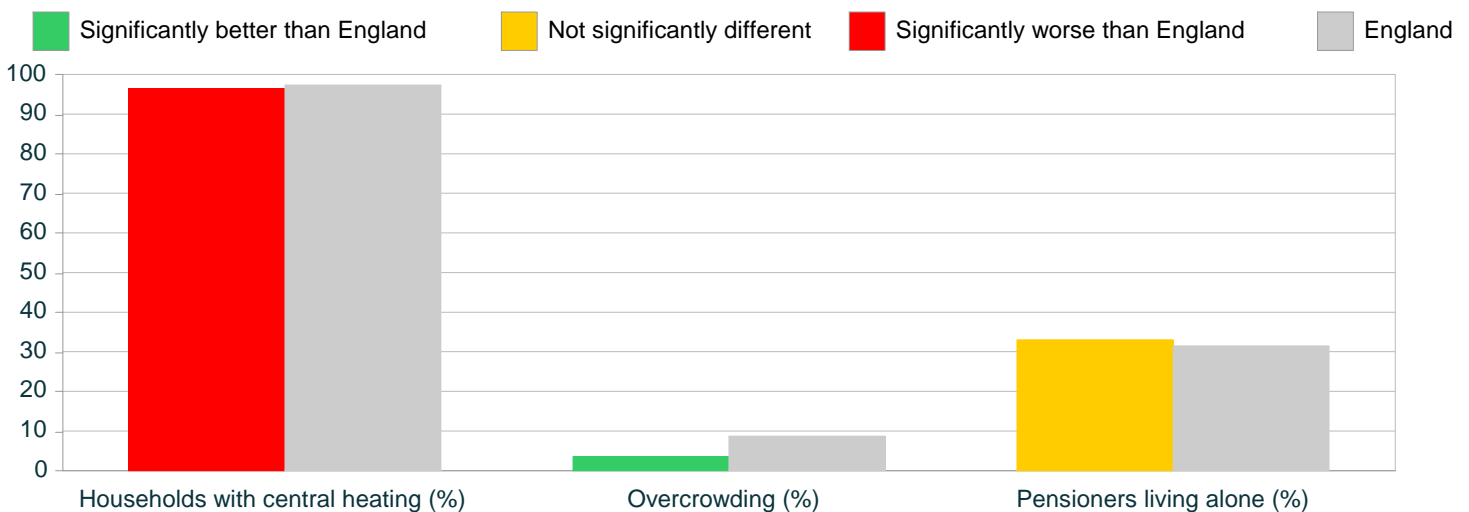

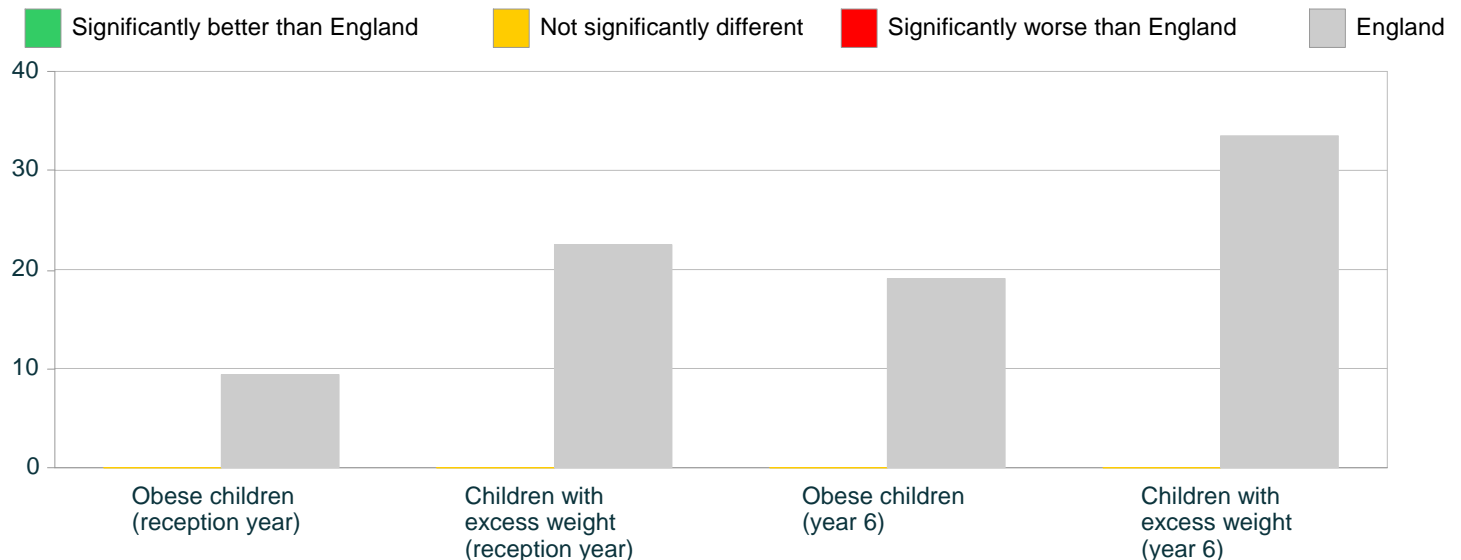

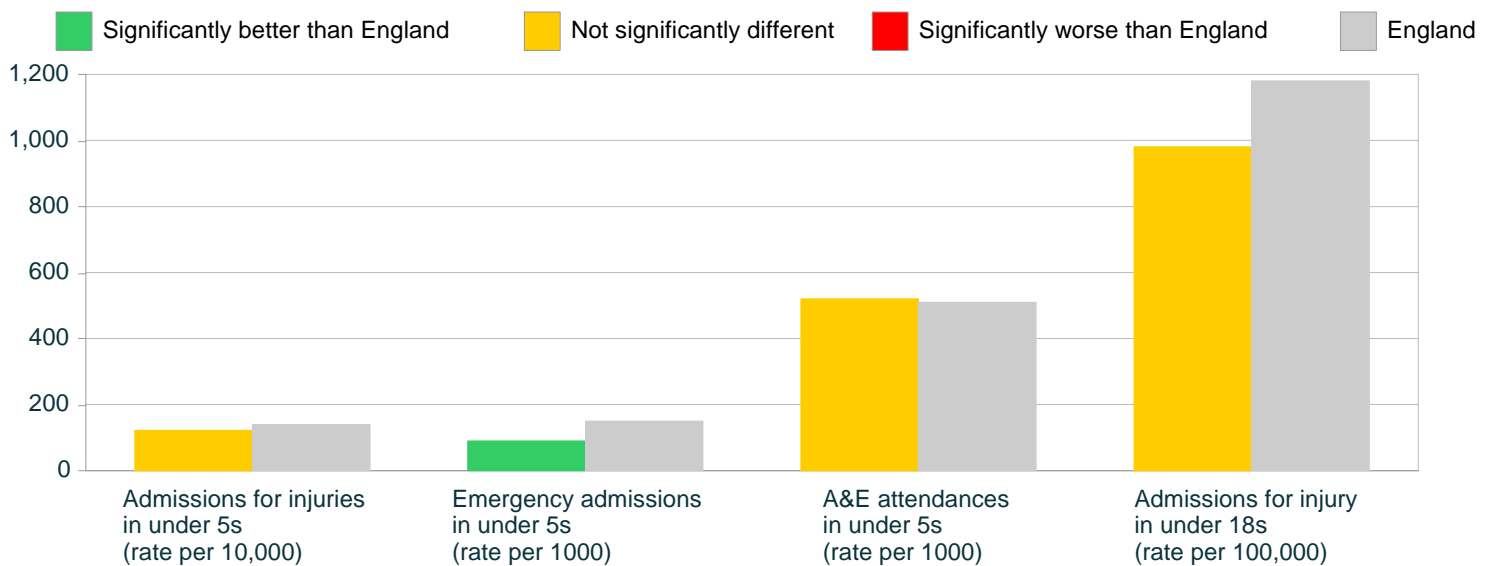

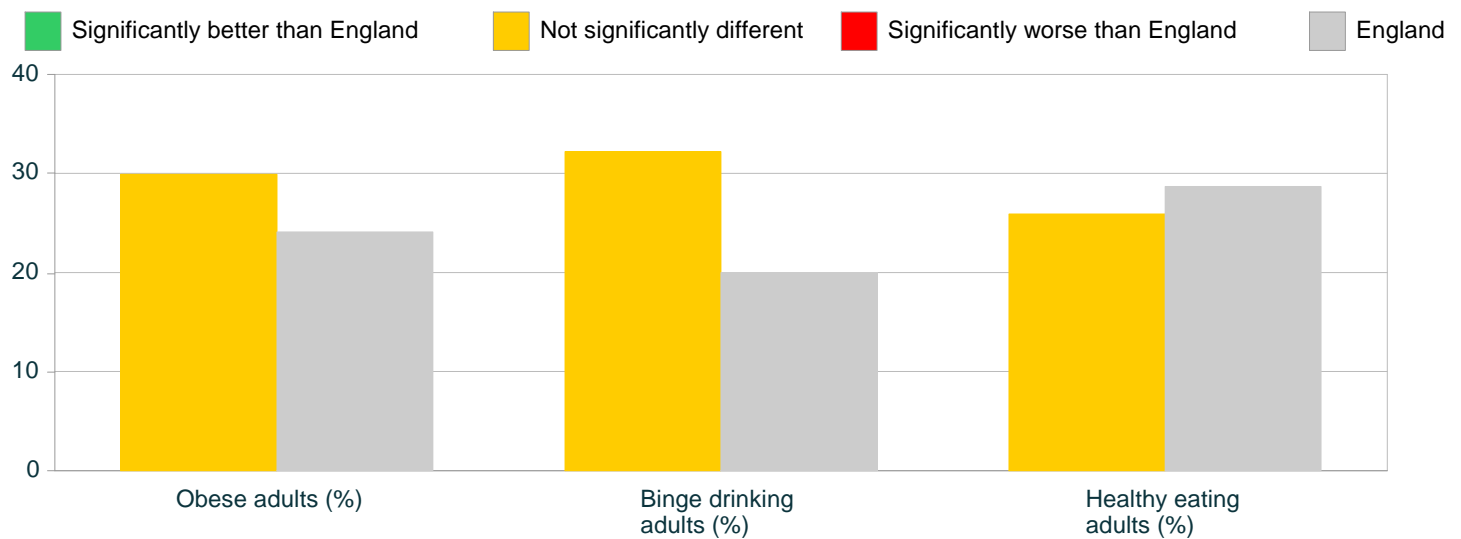

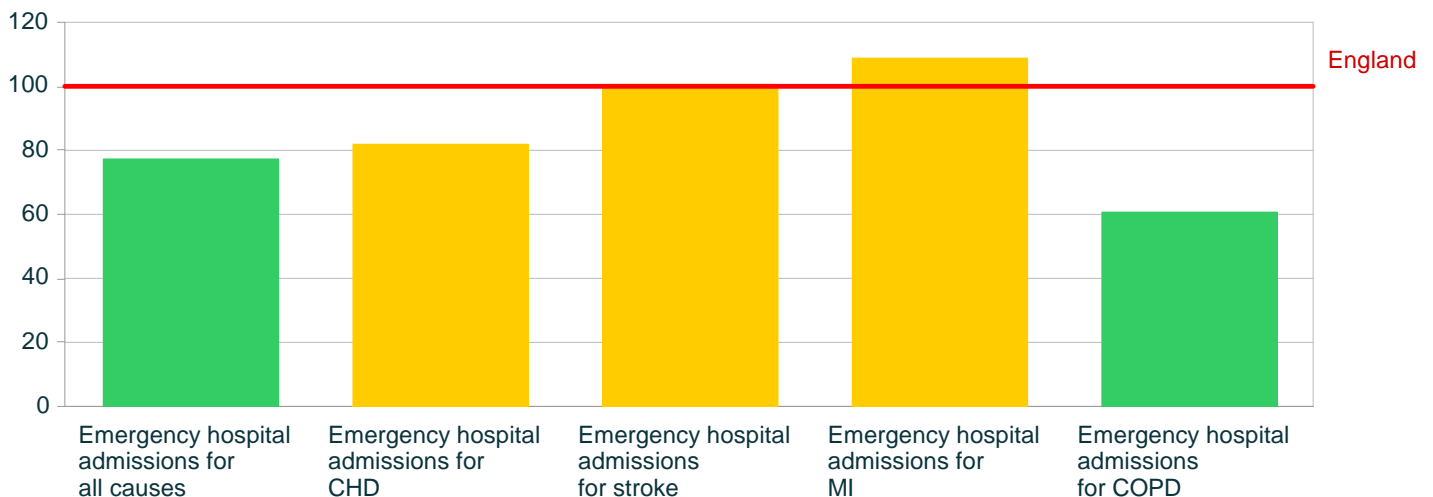

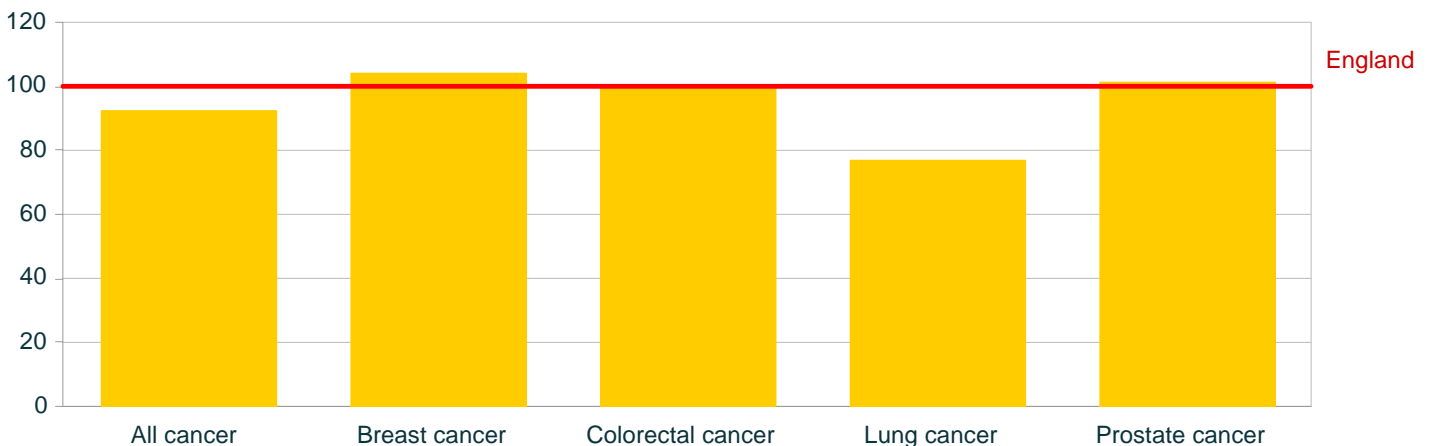

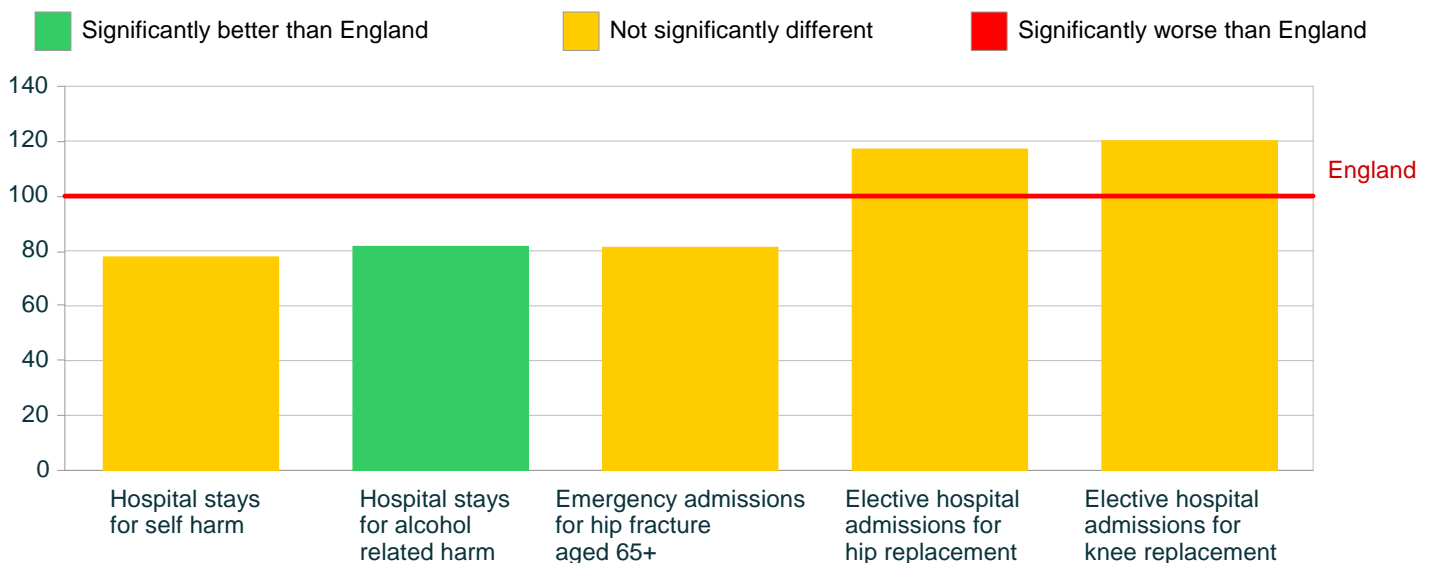

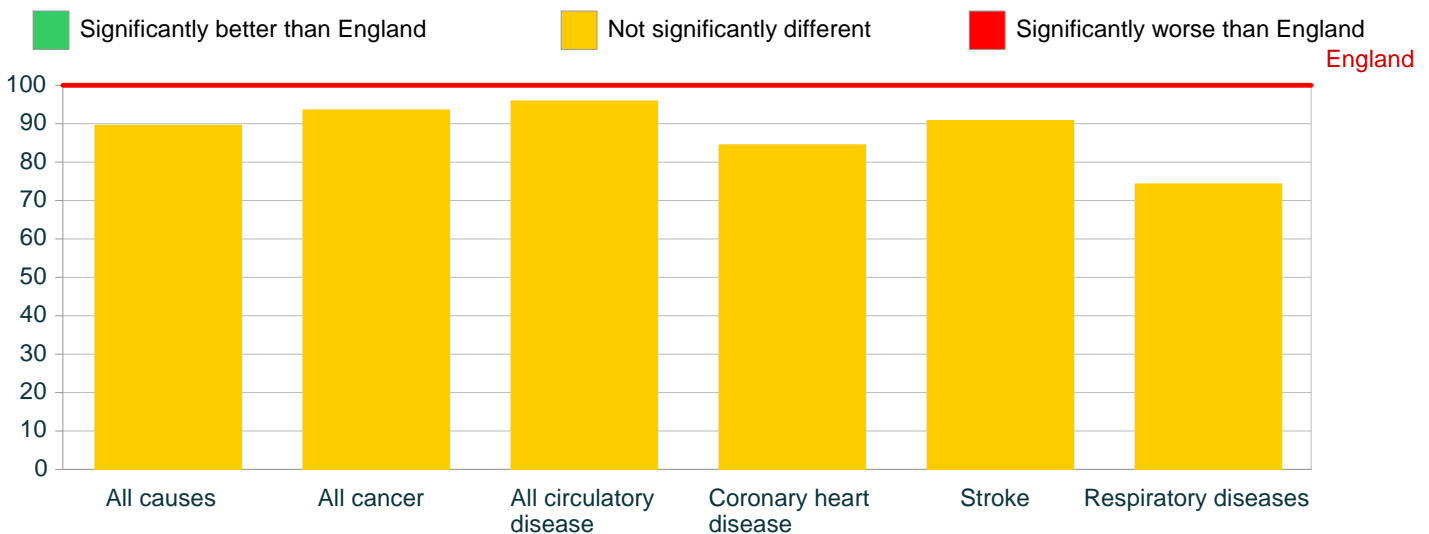

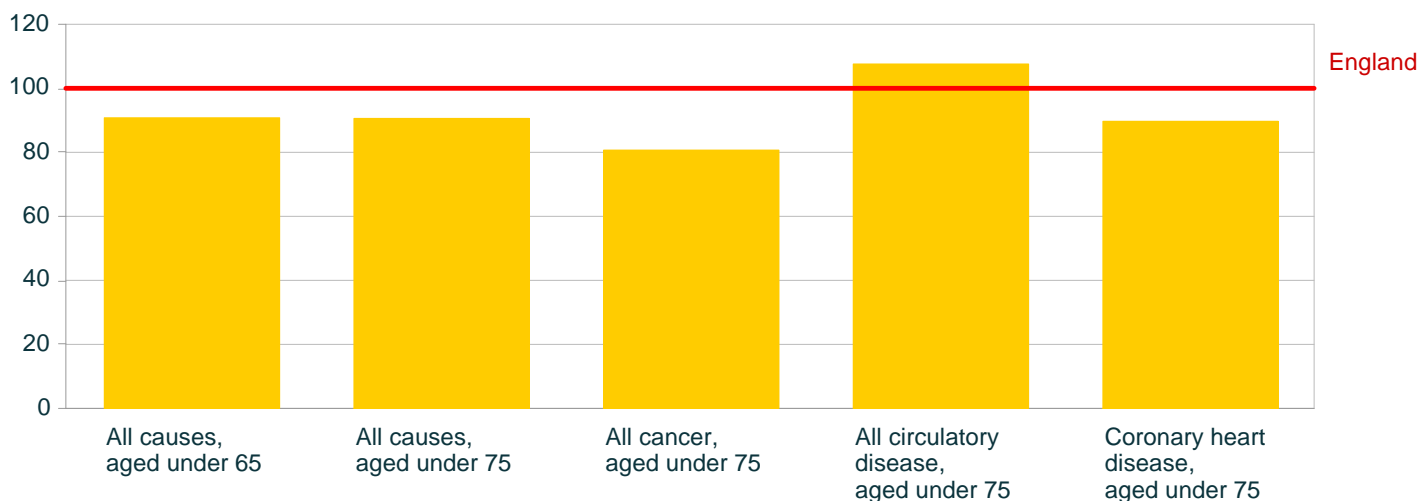

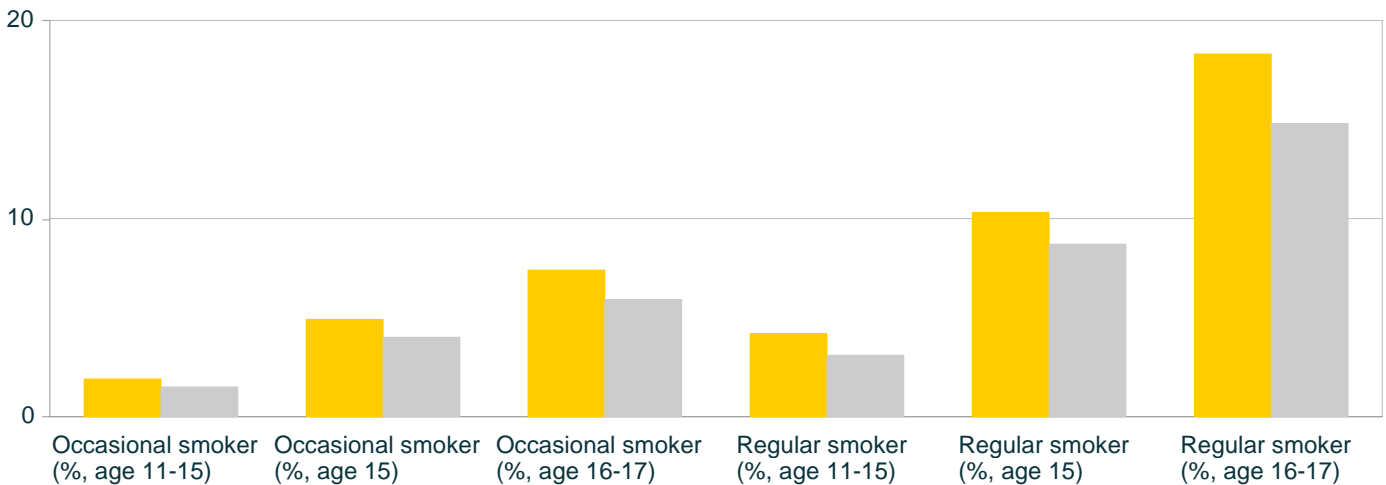

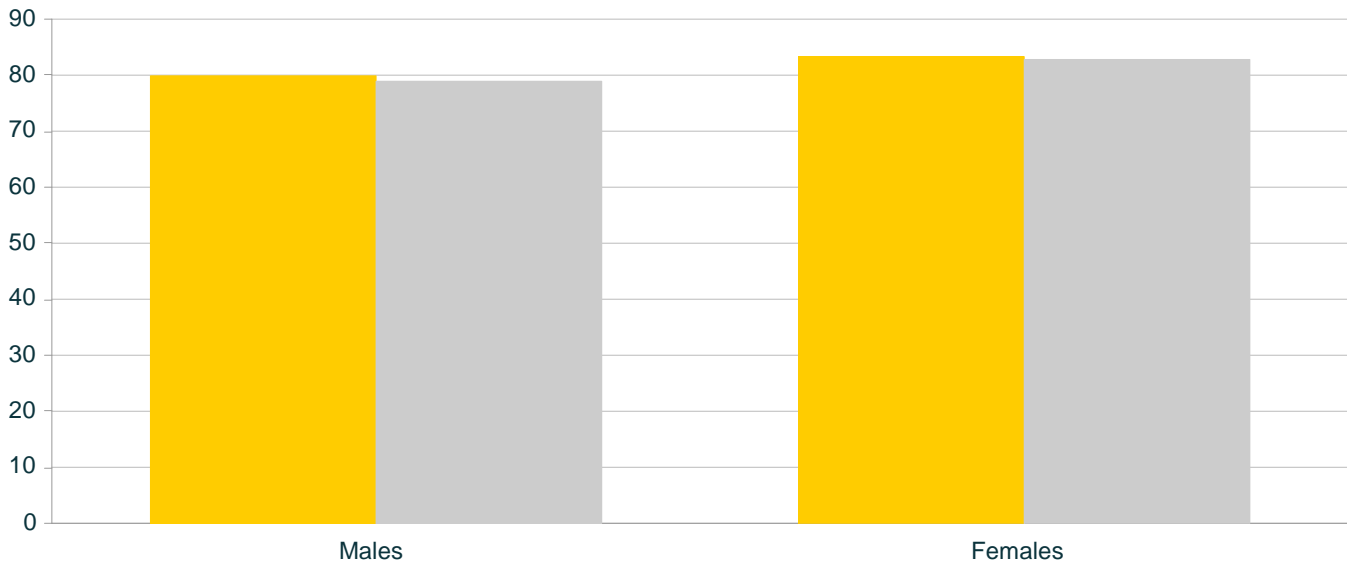
