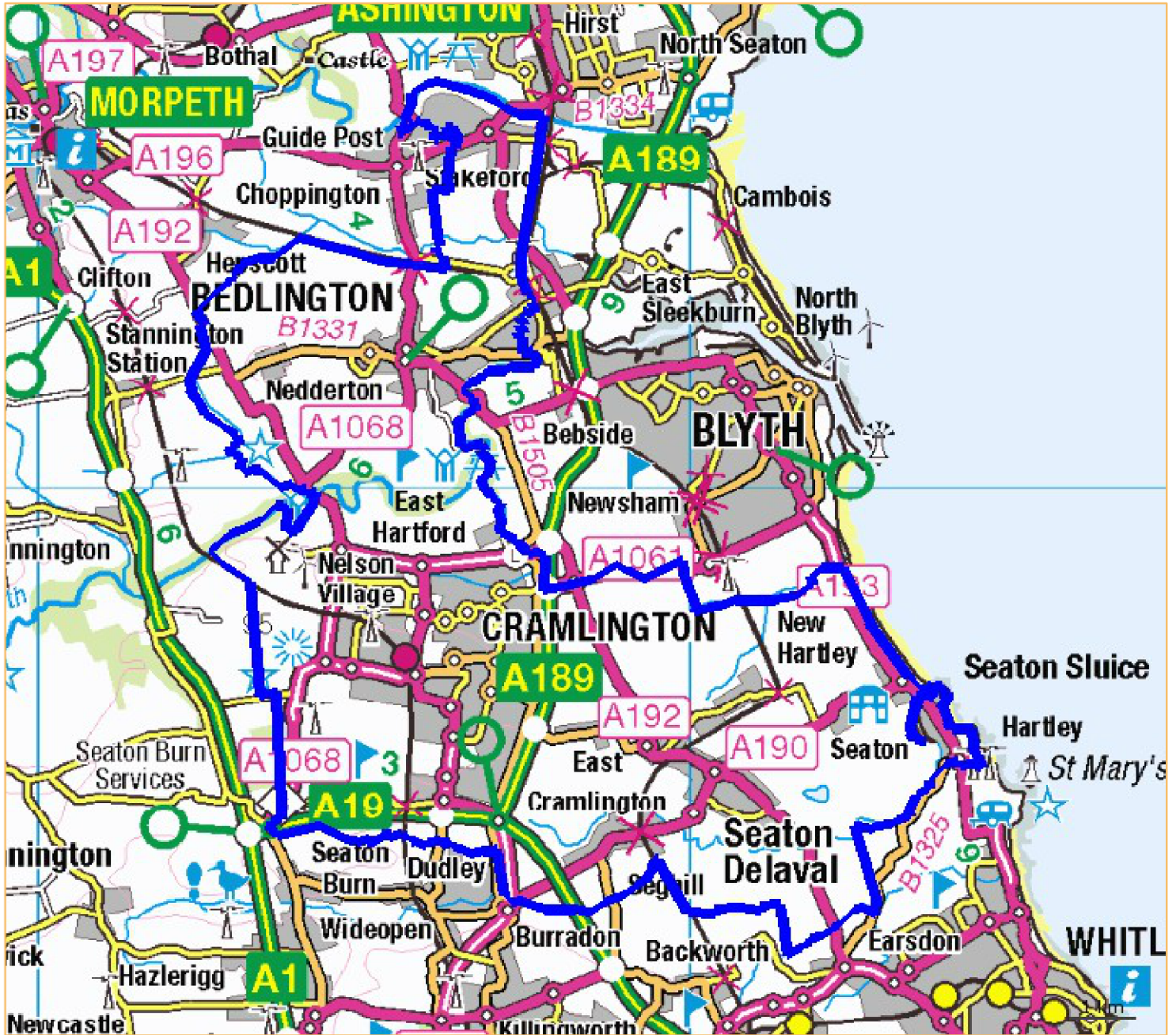

Presentation map



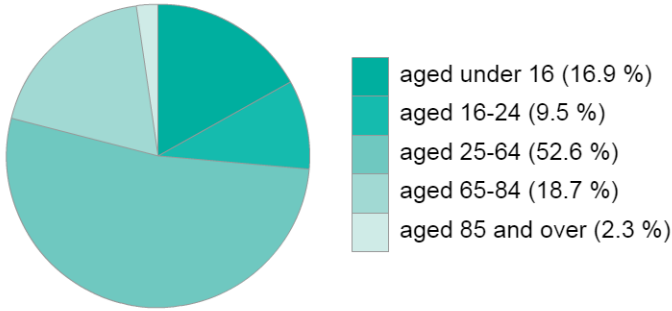

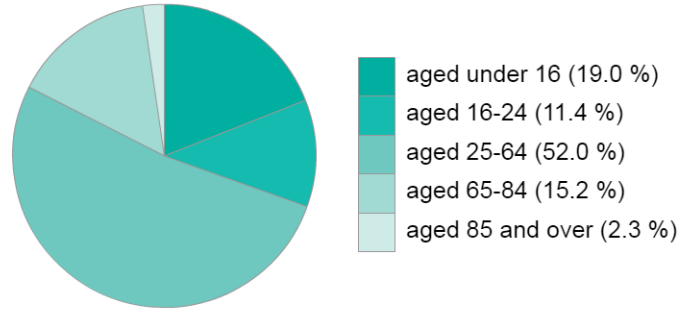

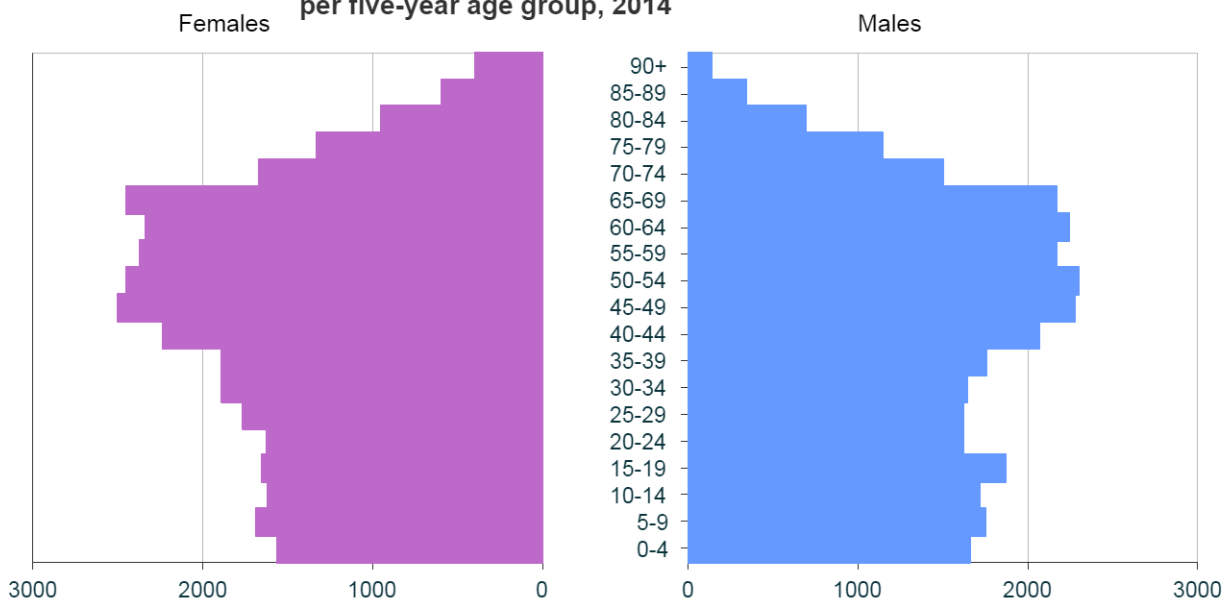

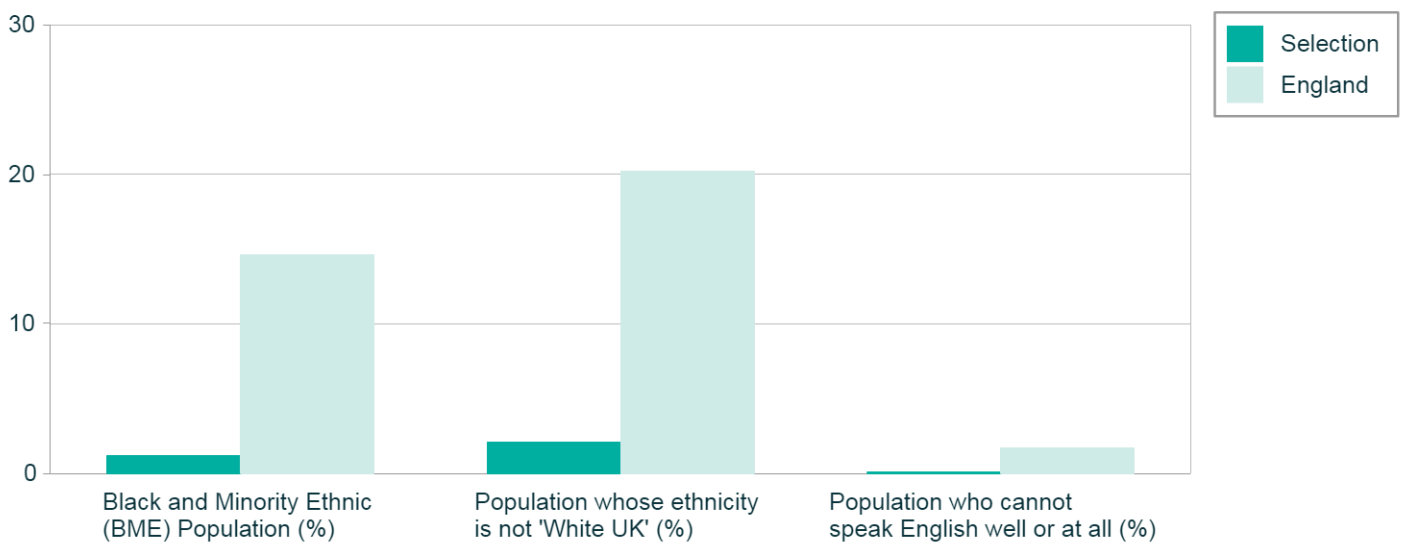

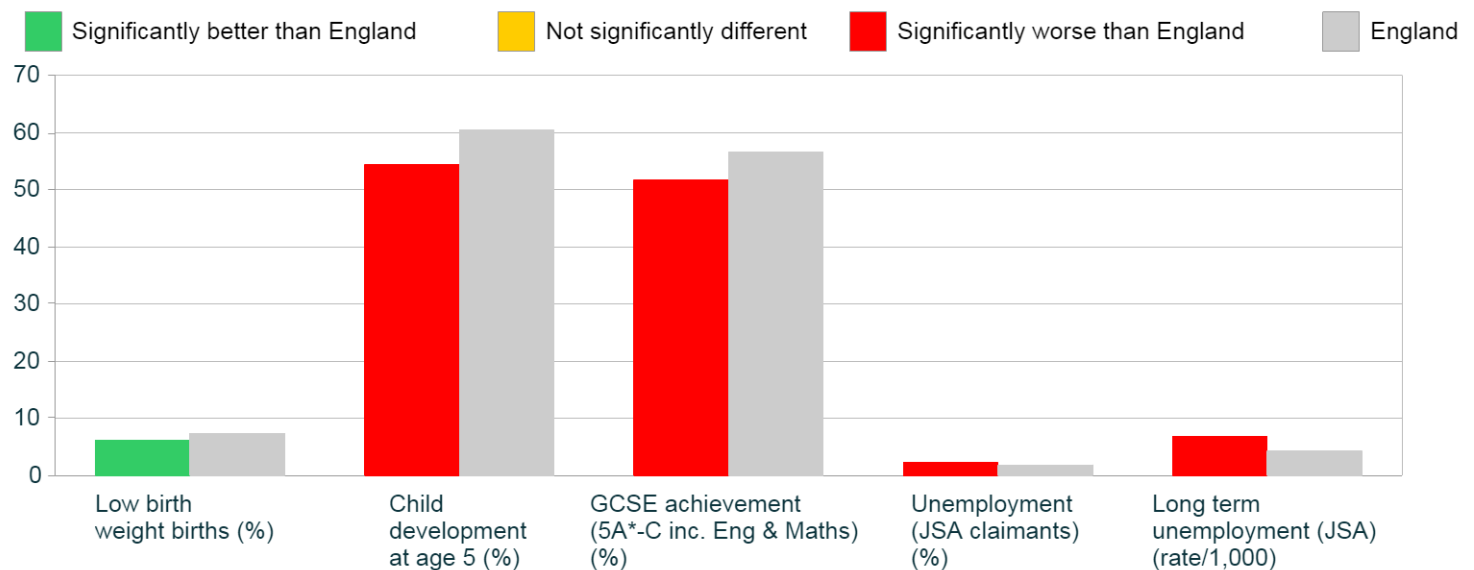

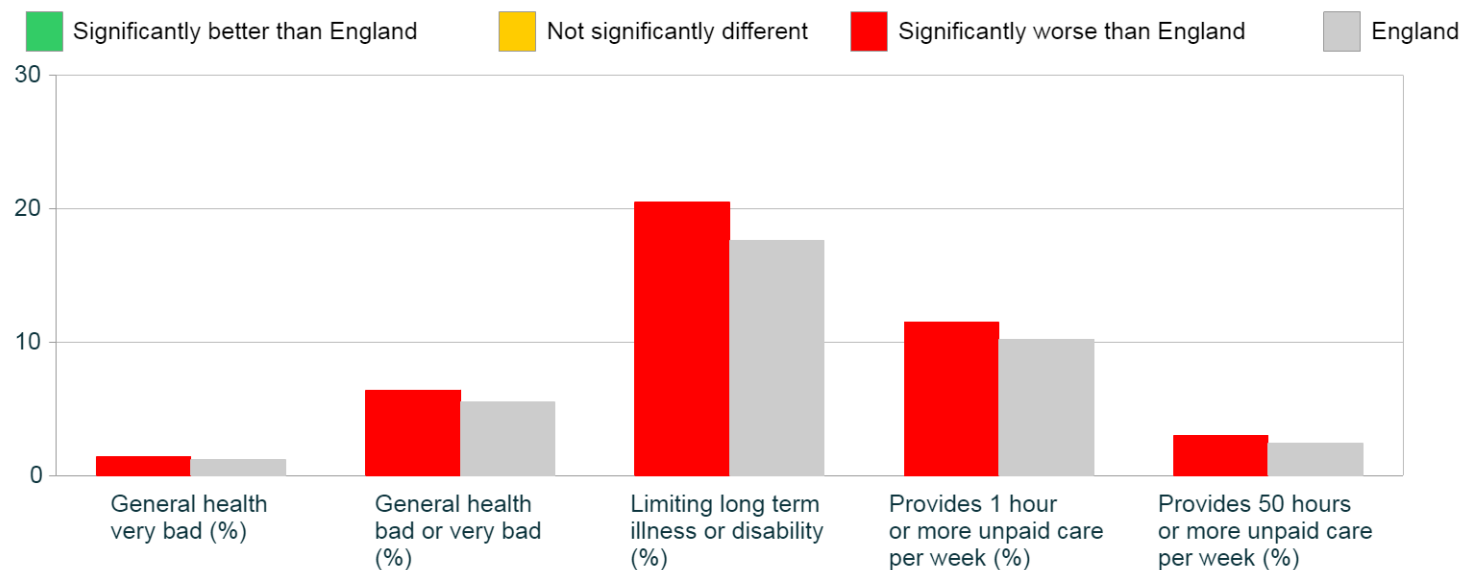

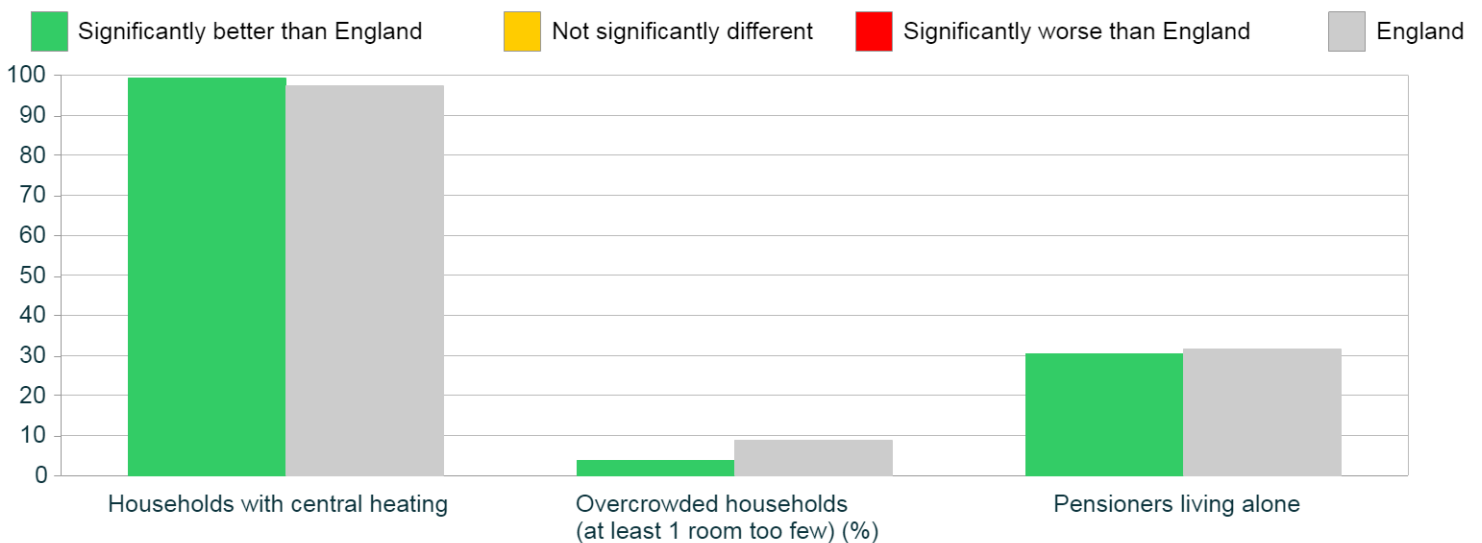

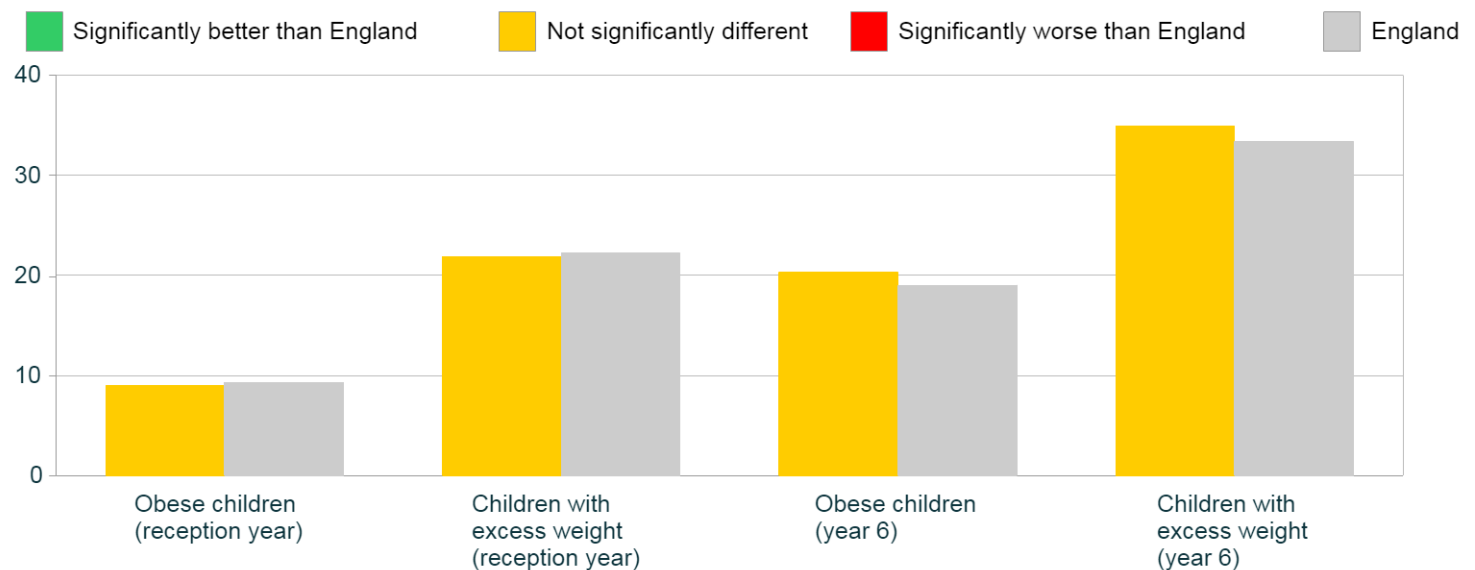

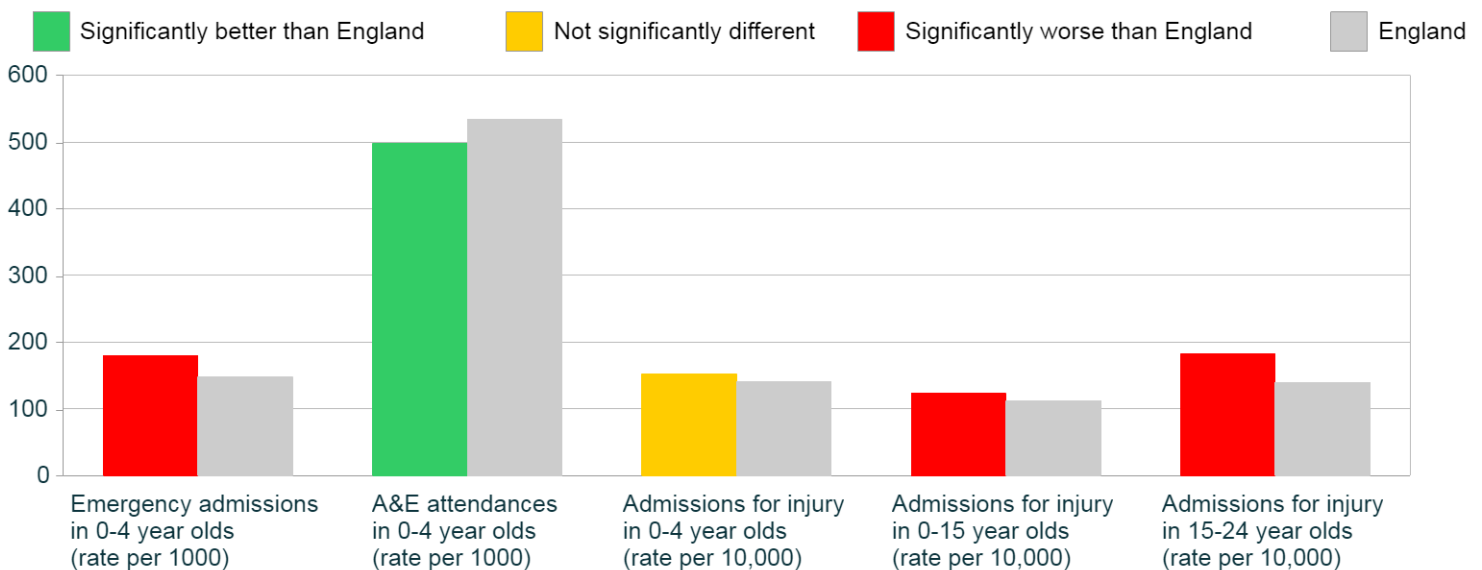

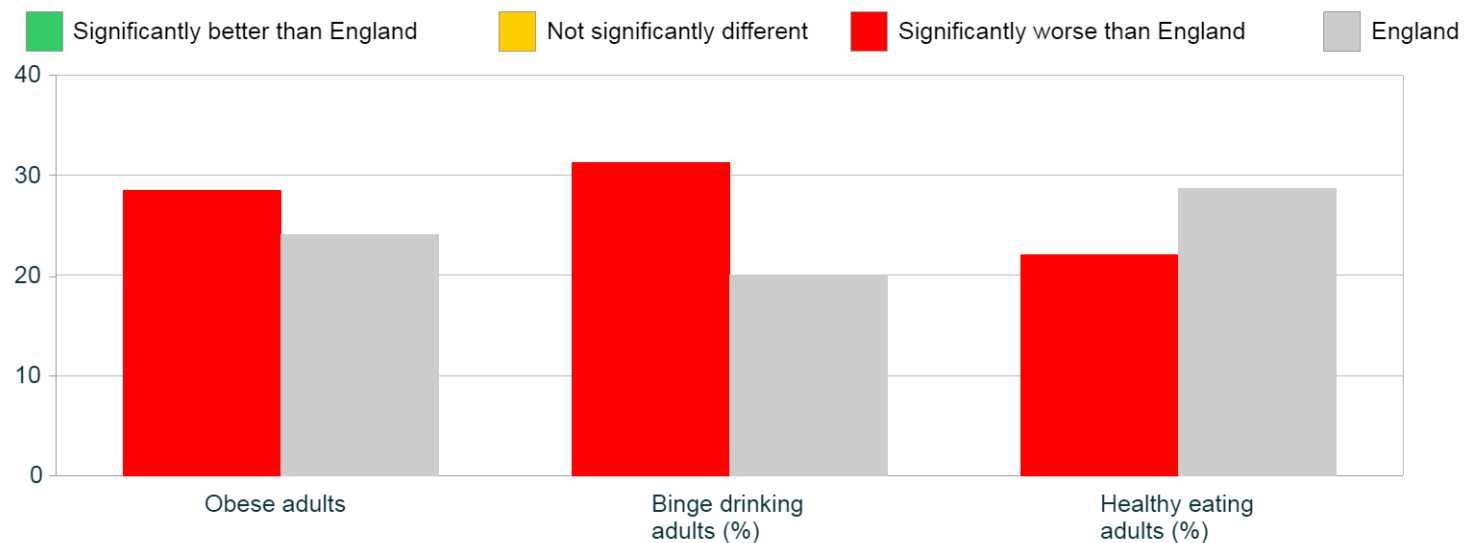

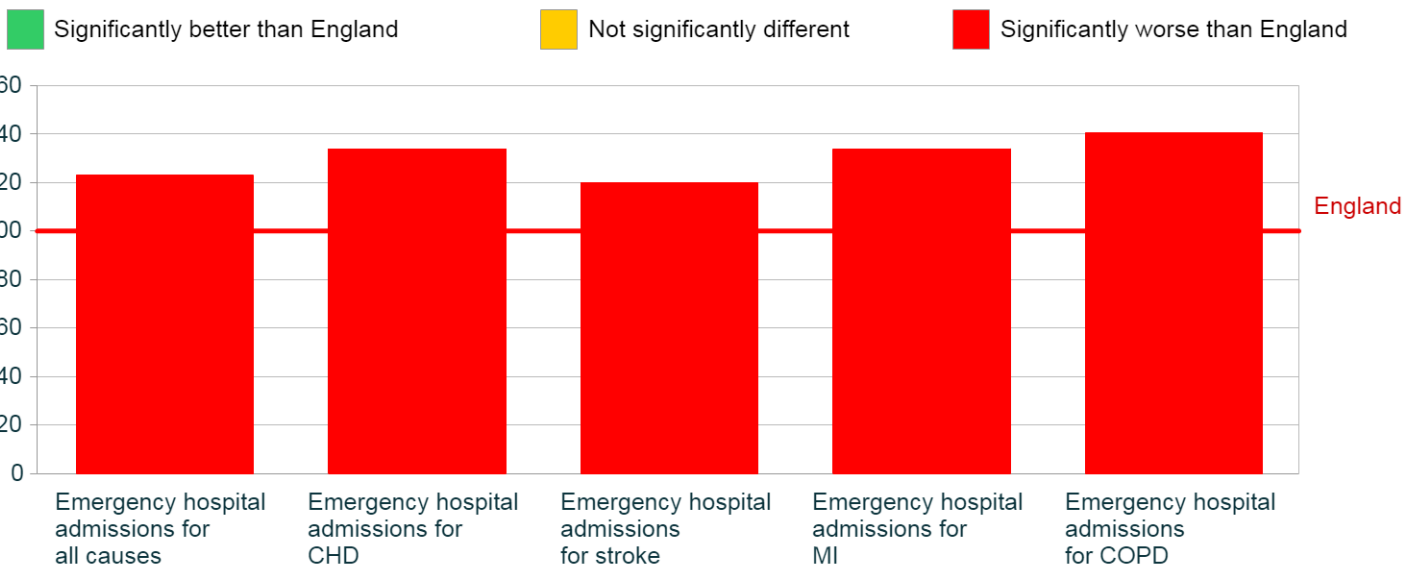

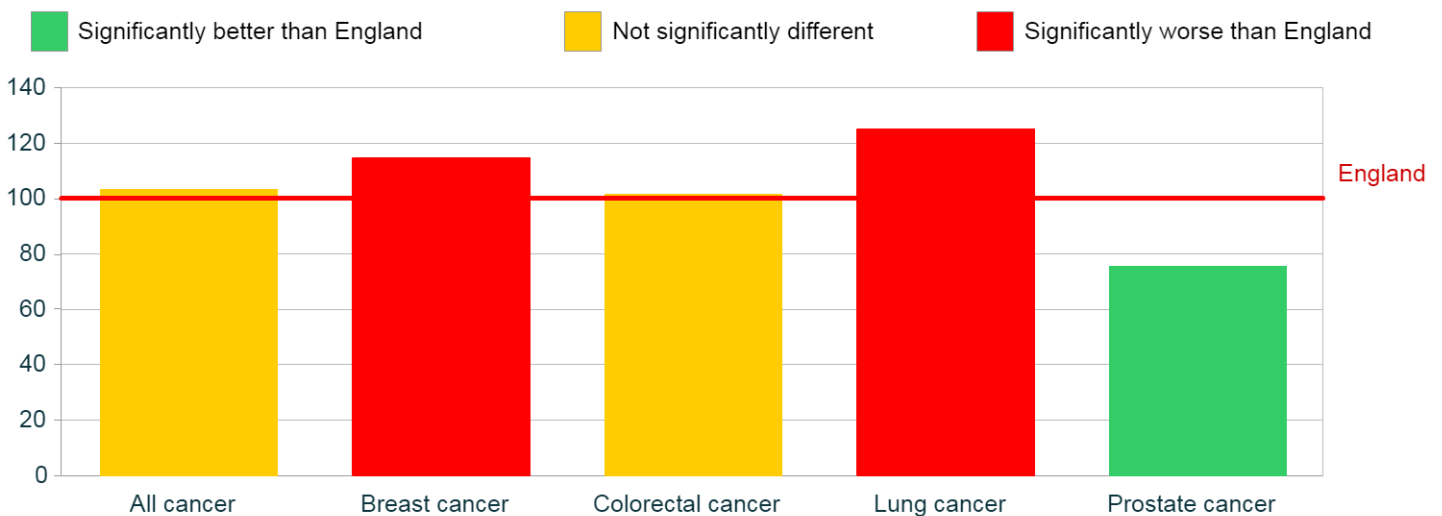

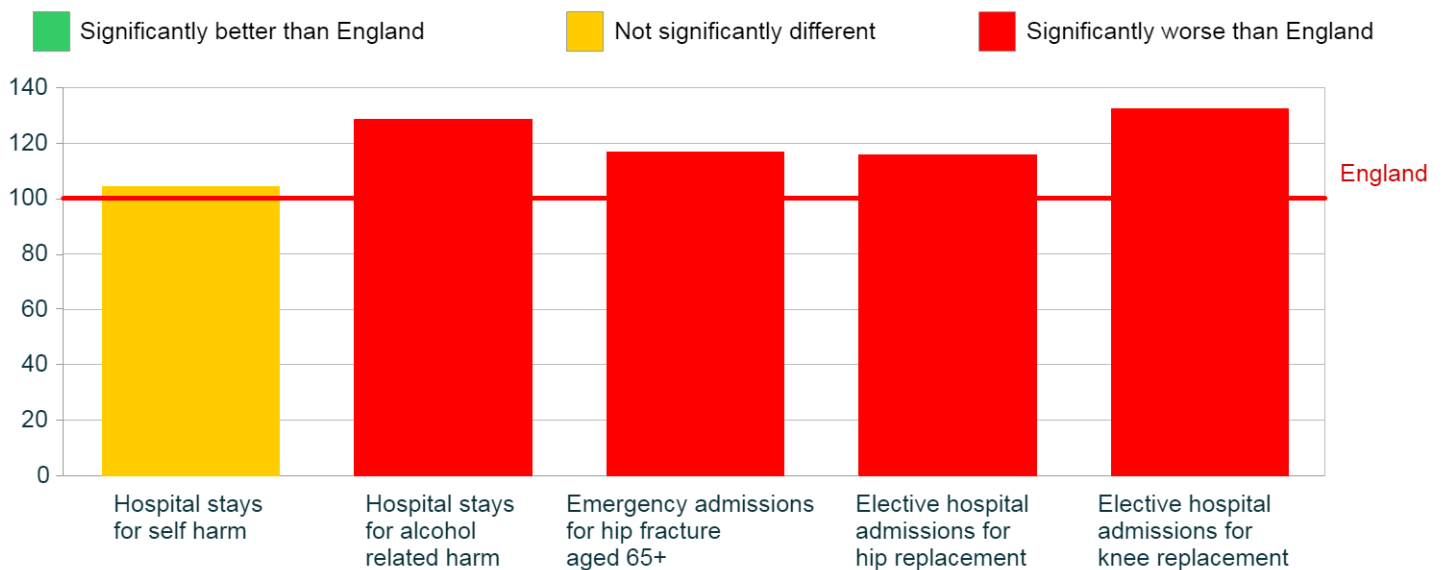

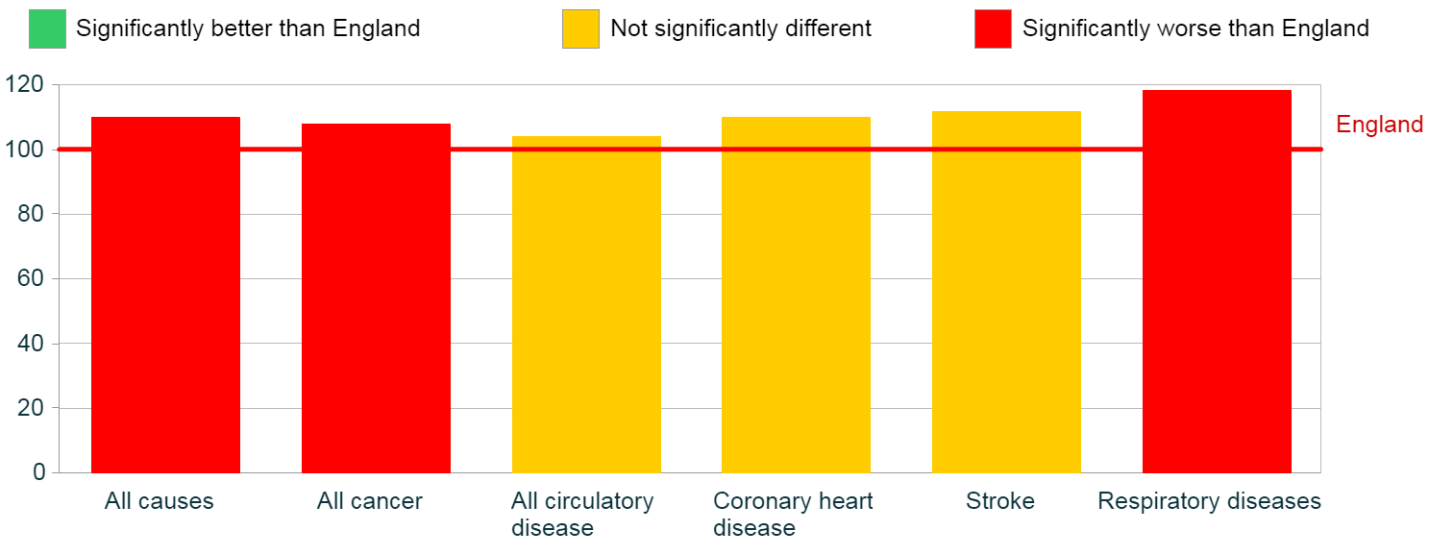

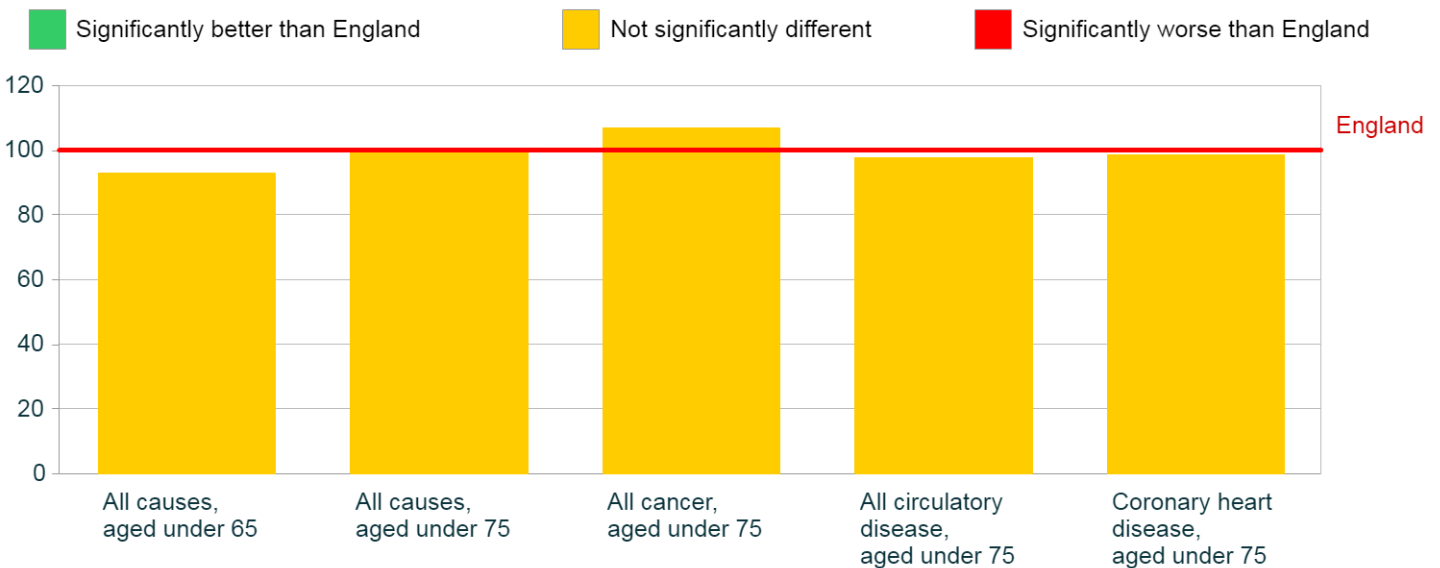
