All information provided in the fact sheets has been adapted by the Northumberland County Council Policy and Research Team from 2011 Census Key and Quick Statistics tables published by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) via the Neighbourhood Statistics website (accessed on 27 January 2013). All information is subject to © Crown copyright and has been adapted from data from the Office for National Statistics licensed under the Open Government Licence v.1.0.

ACCURACY

Ward statistics released by ONS from the 2011 Census have been created by grouping together Census Output Areas (the smallest geographic unit for which outputs are published) to best fit Ward boundaries. This does have an impact on the accuracy of the ward statistics depending on how well each ward boundary corresponds to the Census Output Area boundaries. ONS have concluded that overall best fit estimates are not significantly different to exact fit estimates. For more information on how ONS produced best-fit estimates please visit the following page on the ONS website. Further information on the factors that affect the accuracy of 2011 Census estimates can be found for each indicator on the metadata sheets available via the 2011 Census topic section on the Neighbourhood Statistics website.

The Northumberland Knowledge Ward Fact Sheets provide counts of people, dwellings, household spaces and households unrounded as published by ONS. It should not be assumed that the estimates are exact. The decision was taken not to round estimates for the following reasons;

- to give users access to the best estimate of the true population,
- to allow users to compare results with other ward information released by ONS from the 2011 Census, and
- to allow users to perform further calculations without unnecessarily skewing results.

Percentages included in the fact sheets are all rounded to one decimal place as published by ONS.

POPULATION DENSITY AND AREA MEASUREMENTS

The population density figures provided in the fact sheets are those published by ONS and use the area measurements (area to mean high water excluding inland water figures' or 'land area') of the Census Output Areas used to 'best fit' the ward boundaries.

The area figure quoted below the map at the top of each fact sheet is the actual measurement (extent of realm) of the ward boundary taken from the ONS 2011 Standard Area Measurements dataset. This figure is what ONS recommend you use if quoting the area of a ward or other area.

However if you are calculating population density a different figure should be used, if you require advice on which figure to use please contact the Northumberland County Council Policy and research team using the e-mail address at the bottom of this document. DEFINITIONS

Below are definitions organised by topic of the terms used in the fact sheets (these have been taken directly from the metadata sheets on the ONS Neighbourhood Statistics website).

Population (KS101EW - Usual Resident Population, KS102EW - Age Structure)

<u>All usual residents</u> - For 2011 Census purposes, a usual resident of the UK is anyone who, on census day, was in the UK and had stayed or intended to stay in the UK for a period of 12 months or more, or had a permanent UK address and was outside the UK and intended to be outside the UK for less than 12 months.

<u>Age</u> - Age is derived from the date of birth question and is a person's age at their last birthday. Dates of birth that imply an age over 115 are treated as invalid and the person's age is imputed. Infants less than one year old are classified as 0 years of age.

<u>Median age</u> - The median age is the middle value when all the ages are arranged in order from youngest to oldest. Ages used are the age at last birthday (in whole years).

Health (KS301EW - Health and Provision of Unpaid Care)

<u>Long-term health problem or disability</u> - A long-term health problem or disability that limits a person's day-to-day activities, and has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months. This includes problems that are related to old age. People were asked to assess whether their daily activities were limited a lot or a little by such a health problem, or whether their daily activities were not limited at all.

<u>General health</u> - General health is a self-assessment of a person's general state of health. People were asked to assess whether their health was very good, good, fair, bad or very bad. This assessment is not based on a person's health over any specified period of time.

Religion (KS209EW - Religion)

This is a person's current religion, or if the person does not have a religion, 'no religion'. No determination is made about whether a person was a practicing member of a religion. Unlike other census questions where missing answers are imputed, this question was voluntary, and where no answer was provided the response is categorised as 'Not stated'.

Ethnic group (KS201EW - Ethnic Group)

Ethnic group classifies people according to their own perceived ethnic group and cultural background.

Households and Household Spaces (KS401EW - Dwellings, Household Spaces and Accommodation Type, PHP01)

Household - A household is defined as:

- one person living alone, or
- a group of people (not necessarily related) living at the same address who share cooking facilities and share a living room or sitting room or dining area.

This includes:

 sheltered accommodation units in an establishment where 50 per cent or more have their own kitchens (irrespective of whether there are other communal facilities) • all people living in caravans on any type of site that is their usual residence. This will include anyone who has no other usual residence elsewhere in the UK.

A household must contain at least one person whose place of usual residence is at the address. A group of short-term residents living together is not classified as a household, and neither is a group of people at an address where only visitors are staying.

<u>Household space</u> - A household space is the accommodation used or available for use by an individual household. Household spaces are identified separately in census results as those with at least one usual resident, and those that do not have any usual residents. A household space with no usual residents may still be used by short-term residents, visitors who were present on census night, or a combination of short-term residents and visitors. Vacant household spaces and household spaces that are used as second addresses are also classified in census results as household spaces with no usual residents.

<u>Average household size</u> - The average household size for an area is equal to the total number of usual residents living in households in that area divided by the total number of households in the area that have at least one usual resident. Visitors staying at an address do not contribute to that household's size because they are counted in the household of their place of usual residence.

Overcrowded households (KS403EW - Rooms, Bedrooms and Central Heating)

Occupancy rating - Occupancy rating provides a measure of whether a household's accommodation is overcrowded or under occupied. The ages of the household members and their relationships to each other are used to derive the number of rooms they require, based on a standard formula. The number of rooms required is subtracted from the number of rooms in the household's accommodation to obtain the occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household has one fewer room than required, whereas +1 implies that they have one more room than the standard requirement.

<u>Central heating</u> - A household's accommodation is classified as having central heating if it is present in some or all rooms (whether used or not). Central heating is classified by type, for example one or more of the types - gas, electric (including storage heaters), oil, solid fuel (for example wood or coal) or other types (including solar, Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) or other bottled gas). This info is not available for household spaces with no usual residents.

Tenure (KS402EW - Tenure)

Tenure provides information about whether a household rents or owns the accommodation that it occupies and, if rented, combines this with information about the type of landlord who owns or manages the accommodation.

Household composition (KS105EW - Household Composition)

Household composition classifies households according to the relationships between the household members. Households consisting of one family and no other people are classified according to the type of family (married, same-sex civil partnership or cohabiting couple family, or lone parent family) and the number of dependent children. Other households are classified by the number people, the number of dependent children, or whether the household consists only of students or only of people aged 65 and over.

Marital and civil partnership status (KS103EW - Marital and Civil Partnership Status)

Marital and civil partnership status classifies an individual according to their legal marital or registered same-sex civil partnership status as at census day, 27th March 2011. This topic is the equivalent of the 2001 Census topic 'Marital status', but has undergone significant revision to take account of the Civil Partnership Act which came into force on 5th December 2005. Marital and civil partnership states include married/in a registered same-sex civil partnership, separated (but still legally married/in registered a same-sex civil partnership), divorced/formerly in a registered same-sex civil partnership or

widowed/surviving same-sex civil partner. Although the term 'single' is widely used to cover people in a number of states such as divorced or separated it is not a legally recognised status and was not an option on the census questionnaire. In census results the term 'single' is used to refer only to someone who has never been married or in a registered same-sex civil partnership, which were options on the census questionnaire.

Car or van availability (KS404EW - Car or Van Availability)

<u>Cars and vans</u> - The number of cars or vans that are owned, or available for use, by one or more members of a household. This includes company cars and vans that are available for private use. It does not include motorbikes or scooters, or any cars or vans belonging to visitors. The count of cars or vans in an area relates only to households. Cars or vans used by residents of communal establishments are not counted.

Provision of unpaid care (KS301EW - Health and Provision of Unpaid Care)

A person is a provider of unpaid care if they look after or give help or support to family members, friends, neighbours or others because of long-term physical or mental ill health or disability, or problems related to old age. This does not include any activities as part of paid employment. No distinction is made about whether any care that a person provides is within their own household or outside of the household, so no explicit link can be made about whether the care provided is for a person within the household who has poor general health or a long-term health problem or disability.

Weekly hours worked (KS604EW - Hours Worked)

<u>Hours worked</u> - The number of hours that a person aged 16 to 74 in employment in the week before the census worked in their main job. This includes paid and unpaid overtime

Method of travel to work (QS701EW - Method of Travel to Work)

The method of travel used for the longest part, by distance, of the usual journey to work. This topic is only applicable to people who were in employment in the week before the census.

Economic activity (KS601EW - Economic Activity)

<u>Economic activity</u> - Economic activity relates to whether or not a person who was aged 16 to 74 was working or looking for work in the week before census. Rather than a simple indicator of whether or not someone was currently in employment, it provides a measure of whether or not a person was an active participant in the labour market.

A person's economic activity is derived from their 'Activity last week'. This is an indicator of their status or availability for employment - whether employed, actively looking for work, waiting to start a new job, available to start a new job, or their status if not employed or not seeking employment. Additional information included in the economic activity classification is also derived from information about the number of hours a person works and their type of employment - whether employed or self-employed.

<u>Economically active</u> - A person aged 16 to 74 is described as economically active if, in the week before the census, they were:

- in employment, as an employee of self-employed
- not in employment, but were seeking work and ready to start work within two weeks, or
- not in employment, but waiting to start a job already obtained and available.

Full-time students who fulfil any of these criteria are classified as economically active and are counted separately in the 'Full-time student' category of economically active - they are not included in any of the other categories such as employees

or unemployed. Students who fulfil any of these criteria are also classified as economically inactive. This does not necessarily mean in full-time education and excludes students who were working or in some other way were economically active.

<u>Employee</u> - An employee is a person aged 16 to 74 in employment doing paid work for an individual or organisation. This relates to a person's main job or, if not working at the time of the census, their last main job.

<u>Self-employed</u> - Self-employed people aged 16 to 74 own and operate their own business, professional practice or similar enterprise, including those operated with a partner. This relates to a person's main job or, if not working at the time of the census, their last main job. This can include people who work freelance, which means someone who is self-employed and works (or worked) for different companies on particular pieces of work. Self-employed people who are not freelance can have employees who work for them.

<u>Unemployed</u> - A person aged 16 to 74 is classified as unemployed if they are not in employment, are available to start work in the next two weeks, and either looked for work in the last four weeks or are waiting to start a new job.

<u>Full-time student</u> - A full-time student is a person of any age who has indicated that they are a schoolchild or student in full-time education. Schoolchildren and students in full-time education studying away from their family home are treated as usually resident at their term-time address.

<u>Economically inactive</u> - A person aged 16 to 74 is described as economically inactive if, in the week before the census, they were not in employment but did not meet the criteria to be classified as 'Unemployed' This includes a person looking for work but not available to start work within two weeks, as well as anyone not looking for work, or unable to work - for example retired, looking after home/family, long-term sick or disabled.

Industry (KS605EW - Industry)

The industry in which a person aged 16 to 74 works relates to their main job, and is derived from information provided on the main activity of their employer or business. This is used to assign responses to an industry code based on the Standard Industrial Classification 2007.

Occupation (KS608EW - Occupation)

A person's occupation relates to their main job and is derived from either their job title or details of the activities involved in their job. This is used to assign responses to an occupation code based on the Standard Occupational Classification 2010 (SOC2010).
