



# Know Northumberland – 2011 Census Key Statistics for Wards and Small Areas

April 2013

## Introduction

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) released Key and Quick Statistics tables from the 2011 Census that describe characteristics of the population for a range of different small areas in England and Wales on 31 January 2013. This bulletin summarises these statistics to describe the population for wards in Northumberland (as they stood at the time of the 2011 Census) in respect of who we are, how we live and what we do. The information provided in this bulletin accompanies detailed [Northumberland Ward Fact Sheets](#) that have recently been published on the new Northumberland Knowledge website. Map 3 at the end of this document shows the location of wards in Northumberland.

The statistics have also been released for Output Areas and Super Output Areas which are small areas of a consistent population size that do not undergo boundary changes between Censuses. These areas can be used as a stable building block to produce statistics for custom areas that can be compared with information from the 2001 Census. The Northumberland County Council Policy and Research team will use statistics released at these geographies to produce regularly updated [profiles for 27 Locality Areas](#) in Northumberland. These profiles will be presented on the Northumberland Knowledge website once they are produced. ONS also released these statistics for parishes, wards, post code sectors, national parks, local authorities and health areas in England and Wales.

The next release of information from the 2011 Census, 'Detailed Characteristics' is scheduled for release by June 2013 and will present further information for higher level geographies including middle layer super output areas, wards, unitary and local authorities, regions, countries, health areas, and national parks. The first phase of this release is scheduled for 16 May and will cover Migration; ethnicity, identity, language, religion, and health for local authority areas.

## Key Points

- In terms of population Prudhoe East (5,829 people) is the largest ward in Northumberland and Cramlington South East (3,850 people) is the smallest.
- Bamburgh Ward (29 per cent) has the highest percentage of people aged 65 and over in Northumberland.
- Bellingham (0.0 people per hectare) is the most sparsely populated ward in Northumberland and Plessey is the most densely populated (55).
- Cramlington North (96 per cent) has the highest percentage of residents who own their own homes, while Isabella Ward (46 per cent) has the highest percentage of residents renting from the council or a housing association and Longhoughton (35 per cent) has the highest percentage of the population who rent their home privately.
- Hexham West Ward (48 per cent) has the highest percentage of residents who have achieved a Level 4 or above qualification and Cowpen Ward (37 per cent) has the highest percentage with no qualifications.

## Who we are

### Population


Table 6 at the end of this document contains ward population figures by age and sex. In terms of population Prudhoe East (5,829 people) is the largest ward in Northumberland and Cramlington South East (3,850 people) is the smallest.

The Population of Northumberland is 316,000 according to the 2011 Census and 20 per cent (63,300 people) are aged 65 and over (placing it amongst the top 30 per cent of local authorities in England with the highest percentage of people aged 65 and over). According to the latest interim 2011 Census based population projections this number is projected to increase to more than 25 per cent of the population (83,100 people) by 2021. Map 1B allows us to identify the locations of Wards within Northumberland that have the highest percentage of their population aged 65+. The five Wards with highest proportion of their population aged 65 and over are (highlighted in red in Map 1): **1 Bamburgh** (29 per cent), **2 Morpeth North** (28 per cent), **3 Ponteland South with Heddon** (28 per cent), **4 Lesbury** (27 per cent), **5 Corbridge** (27 per cent).


Northumberland has a population density of 0.6 people per hectare; when compared to other local authority areas in England only six of 326 local authority areas have a lower population density. Map 2 shows that there is a rural urban split within Northumberland. Wards in the South East corner of the county (shaded dark purple on the map) generally have a high population density while areas in the North and West of the county away from the county's main towns (shaded light purple) have low population densities. The five wards with the highest and lowest population densities are highlighted in red and green on Map 1A. The Ward with the lowest population density in Northumberland is **1 Bellingham** (0.0 people per hectare), followed by **2 Rothbury** (0.1), **3 Wooler** (0.1), **4 South Tynedale** (0.1), and **5 Humshaugh** (0.1). The ward with the highest population density is **1 Plessey** (55 people per hectare), followed by **2 Croft** (53), **3 Isabella** (50), **4 Ashington Central** (45), **5 Cramlington Eastfield** (43).

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## Health

In Northumberland 78 per cent (247,400) of residents assessed their general health as either very good or good. A further 15 per cent described their health as fair (48,600), and six per cent (20,000) described their general health as either bad or very bad. Table 2 shows the five wards in Northumberland with the highest proportion of residents rating their health as good/very good and bad/very bad. Cramlington North (89 per cent) has the highest percentage of residents who stated their health was good/very good while Cowpen (11 per cent) has the highest percentage of residents who stated their health was bad/very bad.

## Ethnic Group

In Northumberland 98 per cent of the population belonged to the white ethnic group. Wards in Northumberland with the lowest percentage of the population belonging to the white ethnic group are shown in table 2 below. Ponteland West has the lowest percentage of people belonging to the white ethnic group (93 per cent); 5 per cent of the population identified themselves as Asian/Asian British which is the next most common ethnic group in the ward.

## How we live

This section includes statistics on the usual resident population that lived in households and covers the type of accommodation lived in, and whether it was owned or rented.

## Accommodation Type

In Northumberland 89 per cent (131,200) of households live in a whole house or bungalow (25 per cent Detached, 63 per cent Semi-detached or terraced). 11 per cent of households (16,500) live in a flat, maisonette or apartment.

Table 3 below shows wards with the highest percentage of households who live in different types of accommodation. Ponteland South with Heddon (71 per cent) has the highest percentage of households living in detached houses, Newbiggin Central and East (85 per cent) has the highest percentage living in Semi-detached or terraced housing and Wensleydale (33 per cent) has the highest percentage living in a flat, maisonette or apartment.

## Tenure

Type of tenure refers to whether the household owned or rented their accommodation. In Northumberland 66 per cent of the population owned their own homes, while 19 per cent rented from the council or a housing association and 15 per cent rented their homes privately. Cramlington North (96 per cent) has the highest percentage of residents who own their own homes, while Isabella Ward (46 per cent) has the highest percentage of residents renting from the council or a housing association and Longhoughton (35 per cent) has the highest percentage of the population who rent their home privately. Table 4 shows the five wards with the highest percentage of households by different tenure types.

## What we do

This section covers how people in Northumberland occupied themselves, whether they provided care for less able members of society, and what levels of qualification they had.


### Provision of unpaid care

A person is a provider of unpaid care if they look after or give help or support to family members, friends, neighbours or others because of long-term physical or mental ill health or disability, or problems related to old age. This does not

include any activities as part of paid employment.

In Northumberland 11 per cent (35,700) of residents were giving unpaid care in 2011. The five wards with the lowest and highest percentage of residents giving unpaid care are shown in Chart 1 below. Of Northumberland's 67 wards Berwick East had the lowest percentage of residents giving unpaid care (9%) and Haydon (14%) has the highest.

## Qualifications

This section describes the highest level of qualification members of the population have achieved. This analysis concentrates on residents with no qualifications and residents with Level 4 or above (Bachelors degree or equivalent and higher qualifications).

More than one quarter (26 per cent, 67,000) of Northumberland residents aged 16 and over had a level four or above qualification, while 24 per cent (62,600) had no qualifications. Map 2 shows the proportion of the population achieving Level 4 qualifications and those with no qualifications. The map also highlights the five wards with the highest percentage of population achieving Level 4 qualifications and those with no qualifications. The five wards with the highest percentage of residents with no qualifications fall into the south east corner of the county and the five wards with the highest percentage of residents with Level 4 qualifications are in the west of the county close to the border with Tyne and Wear. Hexham West Ward (48 per cent) has the highest percentage of residents who have achieved a Level 4 or above qualification and Cowpen Ward (37 per cent) has the highest percentage with no qualifications.







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
