Guidance notes for a Companion Pass

What is a companion Pass?

Any resident who qualifies of a Disabled Person's bus pass on the grounds of disability, and because of that disability is unable to travel on a bus without the assistance of another person, can apply for a companion pass.

Your companion may be a carer, a relative or a friend. The pass allows you and your companion to travel free of charge as per the Northumberland concessionary bus pass scheme.

To qualify for a companion pass you must supply evidence from one of the categories below:

A	The applicant is in receipt or has been awarded the higher/enhanced rate care component of Disability Living Allowance/PIP.	A copy of the award letter from the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) or confirmation of award stating that the applicant is in receipt or has been awarded the higher/enhanced rate care component of DLA/PIP. The award date should not have expired and the evidence should be dated within the last 12 months.
В	The applicant is in receipt or has been awarded the higher rate Attendance Allowance issued by the DWP	A copy of the Attendance Allowance award notice or letter from the DWP stating that the applicant has qualified for higher rate Attendance Allowance. The award date should not have expired and the evidence should be dated within the last 12 months.
С	The applicant has been certified as blind and in consequence is registered as blind in a register	A copy of the letter from Local Authority, RNIB, or other Blind Society confirming the applicant is registered as blind on a register maintained by or on behalf of their local authority.
D	The applicant lives in a care/residential home or hospital and are eligible for the higher/enhanced rate care component of the DLA/PIP or higher rate Attendance Allowance	A copy of the award letter from the DWP or confirmation of award stating that the applicant is in receipt of higher/enhanced rate care component of DLA/PIP. Or a copy of the award notice from DWP or confirmation of award stating that the applicant is in receipt of the higher rate Attendance Allowance. The award date should not have expired and the evidence should be dated within the last 12 months.
E	The applicant can provide confirmation from a specialist doctor/ independent health professional/ registered medical practitioner confirming that you are unable to travel alone	A copy of a letter from a specialist doctor/ independent health professional/ registered medical practitioner to confirm that you are unable to travel alone

Your companion is not issued a separate pass. A companion pass has an orange stripe down the right hand side of the pass with a C+ symbol at the top right hand corner which tells the driver that you require a companion. Your companion **CANNOT** use your pass without you.

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
