Proposed Amendment to One Way System, Ford Avenue, Ashington

Purpose of Report

To consider road safety concerns and the possibility of changing the direction of the one way system on Ford Avenue, Ashington to alleviate these concerns.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the direction of the one way system on Ford Avenue, Ashington be changed in order to alleviate concerns.

Key Issues

- Residents have raised safety concerns for both pedestrians and motorists caused by cars driving the wrong way on Ford Avenue, Ashington. As traffic drives in the wrong direction residents, pedestrians and other drivers are not expecting them and this is causing safety issues.
- 2. The scheme is to be funded by Councillor Gallacher, through his Members Local Improvement Scheme allowance.

Delegated decisions

Background

- 1. Residents contacted their local Ward member with safety concerns for both pedestrians and motorists caused by cars driving the wrong way on Ford Avenue, Ashington. As traffic drives in the wrong direction residents, pedestrians and other drivers are not expecting them and this is causing safety issues.
- 2. After meeting with Councillor Gallacher, officers proposed that the current direction of the one way system be changed in order to alleviate these concerns and improve traffic flow.
- 3. A consultation letter was sent to 10 residents and 17 statutory consultees on the proposed change to the one way system. A copy of the consultation letter is attached in Appendix A.
- 4. 3 responses were received as a result of the consultation letter, with 3 in favour and 0 against the proposal. A summary of the responses is attached as Appendix B.
- 5. The results of the consultation were discussed with Councillor Gallacher, who agreed that the restrictions should be changed.
- 6. The scheme is supported by Councillor Gallacher and funded through his Members' Local Improvement Scheme allocation.

Proposed Amendment to One Way System, Ford Avenue, Ashington

Concerns have been raised with County Councillor Gallacher, regarding the current one way system around Bowman Square, causing potential traffic safety issues. It is reported that vehicles are ignoring the current restriction and driving the wrong way as a shortcut. Councillor Gallacher has therefore requested that the direction of the one way be changed on Ford Avenue in order to alleviate these concerns.

I am therefore writing in accordance with Regulation 5 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 (as amended) to formally ask for your comments on the proposal to amend the current one way system on Ford Avenue, Ashington.
