Proposed Parking Restrictions, Jubilee Club entrance on Highcliffe, Spittal

Purpose of Report

To consider the introduction of proposed parking restrictions at Jubilee Club entrance on Highcliffe, Spittal.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the following parking restrictions are introduced: No Waiting at Any Time restrictions (Double yellow Lines).

Key Issues

- Residents have raised safety concerns for both pedestrians and motorists caused by parked cars at the entrance to Jubilee Club on Highcliffe, Spittal.
- 2. The scheme is to be funded by Councillor Hill, through her Members Local Improvement Schemes Allowance.

Background

- 1. Residents contacted their local Ward member with concerns regarding safety issues for both pedestrians and motorists caused by parked cars on Highcliffe, Spittal.
- 2. Indiscriminate parking on the road is making it difficult for residents and buses to negotiate this road safely.
- 3. After meeting with Councillor Hill, officers proposed that "No Waiting at Any Time" restrictions be introduced in order to alleviate these concerns.
- 4. A consultation letter was sent to 12 residents and 21 statutory consultees on the proposed parking restrictions. A copy of the consultation letter and plan are attached in Appendix A.
- 3 responses were received as a result of the consultation letter, with 1 in favour 1 against and 1 neither for nor against the proposal. A summary of the responses is attached as Appendix B.
- 6. The results of the consultation were discussed with Councillor Hill, who agreed that the restrictions should be introduced on safety grounds.
- 7. The scheme is supported by Councillor Hill and funded through her Members' Local Improvement Allocation.

Concerns have been raised with County Councillor Hill, regarding vehicles being parked in the vicinity of the entrance to Jubilee Club on Highcliffe, Spittal, causing potential traffic safety issues. It is reported that vehicles are have difficulty negotiating this area safely. Councillor Hill has therefore requested that "No Waiting at Any Time" restrictions be introduced on this corner in order to alleviate these concerns.

I am therefore writing in accordance with Regulation 5 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 (as amended) to formally ask for your comments on the proposal to introduce No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions on the corner at the entrance to the Jubilee Club on Highcliffe, Spittal as shown on the attached plan.

I would urge you to take the opportunity to comment on this important matter as any decision taken will be based upon the responses received from residents who take time to return the consultation form.


