Proposed Amendment to Existing Resident Permit Parking Bullers Green, Morpeth

Cabinet Member: Councillor Glen Sanderson

Purpose of Report

To consider an amendment to the current 'residents permit parking with limited waiting' to 'resident permit parking only' on Bullers Green, Morpeth.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the following parking restrictions are introduced: Resident Permit Parking only.

Link to Corporate Plan

Key Issues

- 1. Residents have raised concerns about indiscriminate parking by non-residents, causing parking problems on Bullers Green.
- 2. The scheme is to be funded by Councillor Bawn, through his Members' Local Improvement Scheme allowance.

Background

- 1. Residents contacted their local Ward member with concerns regarding parking on Bullers Green, Morpeth.
- 2. Indiscriminate parking on the road is making it difficult for residents to park.
- 3. After meeting with Councillor Bawn, officers proposed that an amendment to the existing resident permit parking with limited waiting restrictions be changed to resident permit parking only in order to alleviate these concerns.
- 4. A consultation letter was sent to 51 residents and 17 statutory consultees on the proposed resident permit parking only. A copy of the consultation letter is attached in Appendix A.
- 9 responses were received as a result of the consultation letter, with 8 in favour 0 against and 1 neither for nor against the proposal. A summary of the responses is attached as Appendix B.
- 6. The results of the consultation were discussed with Councillor Bawn, who agreed that the restrictions should be introduced.
- 7. The scheme is supported by Councillor Bawn and funded through his Members' Local Improvement Scheme allocation.
- 8. We will continue to monitor the situation once the resident permit parking has been installed.

Proposed Amendment to Existing Resident Permit Parking Bullers Green, Morpeth

Concerns have been raised by residents of Bullers Green in Morpeth about indiscriminate parking by non-residents, causing parking problems.

Councillor Bawn has therefore agreed to fund an amendment to the current 'residents permit parking with limited waiting' to 'resident permit parking only' if there is a favourable consultation with residents.

I am therefore writing in accordance with Regulation 5 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 (as amended) to formally ask for your comments on the proposals, to amend the existing resident permit parking with limited waiting to 'Residents Permit Parking' at Bullers Green, Morpeth.

Signs would be erected as necessary indicating where Resident Permit Parking is in operation. To cover administrative costs, residents will be asked to purchase Resident Parking Permits. (Currently £25 a year per permit, equivalent to £2.08 per month). A maximum of 2 permits can be provided per household with one permit reserved for residents and one for visitor parking.

A freepost response form is enclosed for you to return your views, or you can email them to HighwaysProgramme@northumberland.gov.uk. I would welcome a reply by **Friday 27th September 2019**. If you wish to respond to this consultation online, please visit the web address http://trafficconsult.northumberland.gov.uk/.

Regrettably, it is not possible to reply to all individual comments. You may also wish to note that any comments received may be included in a Decision Report and may be available for public inspection.

I would urge you to take the opportunity to comment on this important matter as any decision taken will be based upon the responses received from residents who take time to return the consultation form.
