PROPOSED 'NO WAITING AT ANY TIME' PARKING RESTRICTIONS, CHAPEL ROW, SEAHOUSES

Purpose of Report

To consider a proposal to provide 'No Waiting at Any Time' parking restrictions (double yellow lines), in Chapel Row, Seahouses.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the proposed No Waiting at Any Time parking restrictions are implemented.


Key Issues

North Sunderland Parish Council requested parking restrictions to keep the pedestrian route from Chapel Row to Harbour Road clear from obstruction by parked vehicles.

Consultation with residents revealed a wider issue of indiscriminate visitor parking in the cul-de-sac.

Background

 Chapel Row is a residential cul-de-sac located just off the centre of Seahouses and close to the Harbour. It includes sheltered accommodation in ChapelCourt and has a pedestrian link to the harbour via a set of steps. It's location is shown below.



- Because of its close proximity to the village centre and the harbour, the street is subject to indiscriminate parking by visitors seeking to avoid parking charges in the car parks.
- 3. North Sunderland Parish Council raised this issue via the Local Transport Plan process, specifically, the problem of parked cars blocking the steps down to Harbour Road making it difficult for pedestrians to pass through. Residents were therefore consulted on a proposal to protect the area in front of the steps with double yellow lines.
- 4. Although there was support for the proposal, the consultation revealed wider issues related to visitor parking making it difficult for residents to park near their homes.
- 5. It was also stated that vehicles often park on both sides of the road which completely blocks access, including to the private car park for residents and visitors to Chapel Court.
- 6. Residents and statutory consultees were therefore consulted on a proposal to provide 'No Waiting at Any Time' parking restrictions, (double yellow lines), designed to keep one side of the street clear of parked vehicles. A copy of the consultation plan is shown in Appendix A.

- 7. Sixteen responses were received. All were in favour of the proposal. A summary of the responses is shown in Appendix B.
- 8. The local ward Member and Parish Council support the proposal.
- 9. It is therefore recommended that the proposed 'No Waiting at Any Time' parking restrictions are implemented.


