Extension of the 30 MPH Speed Limit Restriction at Hugh Joicey First School, Ford Village

Cabinet Member: Glen Sanderson - Environment & Local Services

Purpose of Report

This report sets out the background to the proposed implementation of an extension to the existing 30 MPH speed limit adjacent to Hugh Joicey First School, Ford Village.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the existing 30 speed limit is extended adjacent to Hugh Joicey First School, Ford Village.

Key Issues

- 1. The provision of an extension to the 30 MPH speed limit adjacent to Hugh Joicey First School is in line with the County Council's current policy.
- This location would benefit from reduced vehicle speeds in the vicinity of Hugh Joicey First School where Vulnerable Road Users (VRUs) are present.
- 3. The scheme is supported by County Councillor Lawrie, Ford Parish Council and Hugh Joicey First School.

Background

Extension of 30 MPH Speed Restriction

The purpose of extending the existing 30 MPH speed restriction on the B6353 Main Road through Ford Village, is primarily to meet the design criteria for an "Advisory 20 MPH Speed Llmit Gateway", adjacent to Hugh Joicey First School, Ford. See Appendix A- Scheme Plan.

The introduction of a 20 MPH speed limit Gateway adjacent to Hugh Joicey First School forms part of the 2019/20 Local Transport Plan. This is part of the County Council's road safety initiative to introduce 20 MPH speed limits adjacent to all schools in Northumberland provided it is feasible to do so. Anecdotal evidence suggests that measures of this kind adjacent to schools provide a safer environment for all road users.

To facilitate this change an extension to the existing 30 MPH speed limit will be included in the new Traffic Regulation Order (TROM_171) and revocation of existing Orders where applicable. Together with road marking and signage changes.

Details of the proposals are shown on the plan at Appendix A.

Council Officers have worked closely with County Councillor Lawrie, Ford Parish Council and Hugh Joicey First Schoolon this scheme.

Northumbria Police, other emergency services and relevant statutory consultees will be notified of these amendments as part of the process for making the permanent Orders.
