Proposed No Waiting At Any Time Parking Restrictions,
Northumberland Avenue, Berwick
Cabinet Member: Glen Sanderson - Environment & Local Services

Purpose of Report

To consider the introduction of No Waiting At Any Time parking restriction on Northumberland Avenue in Berwick due to road safety concerns.

Recommendations

It is recommended that a "No Waiting at Any Time" (Double Yellow Line) parking restriction is introduced on Northumberland Avenue in Berwick.

Key Issues

- 1. Residents have raised safety concerns for both pedestrians and motorists caused by parked cars on Northumberland Avenue.
- 2. The scheme is to be funded by Councillor Seymour, through her Members' Local Improvement Scheme allowance.

Background

Residents contacted their local Ward Member with concerns regarding safety issues for both pedestrians and motorists caused by congestion and indiscriminate parking on Northumberland Avenue.

Indiscriminate parking on the road is making it difficult for residents and visitors to negotiate this road safely.

After meeting with Councillor Seymour, council officers proposed that No Waiting At Any Time parking restrictions be introduced to alleviate these concerns.

Consultation

A consultation letter was sent to 1 resident and 23 statutory consultees inviting comments on the viability of introducing No Waiting At Any Time parking restrictions on Northumberland Avenue. A copy of the consultation letter and plan are attached in Appendix A.

3 responses were received with 3 in favour 0 against the proposal. A summary of the responses is attached as Appendix B.

The results of the consultation were discussed with Councillor Seymour, who agreed that the restrictions should be introduced.

The scheme is supported by Councillor Seymour and funded through her Members' Local Improvement Scheme allocation.

Proposed No Waiting at Any Time Restrictions, Northumberland Avenue, Berwick

Concerns have been raised with County Councillor Seymour, regarding vehicles being parked on Northumberland Avenue, causing potential traffic safety issues. It is reported that vehicles are having difficulty negotiating this area safely. Councillor Seymour has therefore requested that "No Waiting at Any Time" restrictions be introduced on this road in order to alleviate these concerns.


I would urge you to take the opportunity to comment on this important matter as any decision taken will be based upon the responses received from residents who take time to return the consultation form.
