Proposed No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions in The Pastures Stocksfield.

Purpose of Report

This report sets out the background to the proposed implementation of new 'No Waiting' Restrictions (Double Yellow Lines) at the junction of The Pastures and A695 Main Road, Stocksfield.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the new 'No Waiting at Any Time' (Double Yellow Line) restrictions at the junction of The Pastures and A695 Main Road, Stocksfield be introduced.

Key Issues

- 1. There are issues with indiscriminate parking and resulting road safety visibility concerns.
- These issues were raised by the Parish Council and County Councillor Anne Dale
- 3. The decision to introduce a permanent Traffic Regulation Order is supported by the relevant Parish Council and County Councillor Anne Dale.

Background

Following concerns raised by local residents via their Local County Councillor and Stocksfield Parish Council, a number of road safety issues have been highlighted, including poor visibility at junctions and indiscriminate parking.

These concerns were raised with NCC Officers during the preparation of another LTP Scheme - A695 Broomley First School. There appears to be a history of indiscriminate parking at the junction of The Pastures and A695 Main Road Stocksfield, especially at peak times for the adjacent Broomley School.

It is anticipated that the proposed introduction of No Waiting At Any Time restriction (double yellow line) will go some way to reduce these road safety concerns.

Notification of these changes will be advertised as part of the legal process of making this Permanent Traffic Regulation Order.

Northumbria Police, other emergency services and relevant statutory consultees will be notified of this new Traffic Regulation Order.
