PROPOSED 30MPH SPEED LIMIT, C166/U4052, WINGATES

Purpose of Report

To consider the results of the consultation exercise regarding a proposal to provide a 30mph speed limit in the village of Wingates.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the proposed 30mph speed limit is implemented.

Key Issues

The County Council has received concerns from Nunnykirk Parish Council and the local ward member about the speed of traffic in Wingates.

The village is currently subject to the national speed limit of 60mph.

Background

- The County Council has received concerns from Nunnykirk Parish Council and the local ward member about the speed of traffic in Wingates.
- 2. The village does not currently have a reduced speed limit and is therefore subject to the national speed limit of 60mph.
- Traffic Advisory Leaflet 01/04 (DfT 2004) suggests a reasonable minimum criteria for the definition of a village for the purpose of applying a 30mph speed limit are
 - o 20 or more houses, and
 - A minimum length of 600 metres
- 4. There are more than 20 individual addresses in Wingates. The length of the proposed speed limit is only 200 metres, however, the village is a cul-de-sac and there is no through traffic, so this factor is less important.
- 5. It is considered that the village environment, narrow road, frequent use by agricultural vehicles and livestock and the presence of an active sawmill justifies a lowered speed limit.
- 6. Residents and statutory consultees were consulted on the proposal. A copy of the consultation plan is shown in Appendix A.
- 7. Only one response was received which was in favour of the proposal. There were no responses against. A copy of the response is shown in Appendix B.
- 8. Both Nunnykirk Parish Council and the local ward member support the proposal.
- 9. It is therefore recommended that the proposed 30mph speed limit should be implemented.
