Proposed Residents' Permit Parking – The Croft & South Farm, Nedderton

**Purpose of Addendum** 

Following the legal advertisement of the Traffic Regulation Order to enforce the permit parking area at The Croft and South Farm, the Council received a formal objection to the scheme.

Officers have reviewed the comments made within the objection and recommend that the scheme should be implemented as originally proposed. The plan that was originally advertised can be found in Appendix A and the formal objection is detailed in Appendix B.



# Appendix B - Objection and Acknowledgement

I write to object to the proposal for resident only parking for the entire length of south farm and the Croft.

The reasons for my objection:

I believe you had a duty to publicly display your intended plans online. Having looked today I cannot see the plans or the maps you mention.

I objected initially but didn't receive a reply!

Furthermore......

My mum is 75 and has leukaemia, she visits my home regularly and is actually recorded as one of the registered owners of xxxxx. Due to her age and limited mobility she needs to park in south farm. As neighbours often have visitors the parking lay-by is often full. As such she parks on the road leading into south farm.

My father is 75 and has a bad back, when he visits my home, xxxxx, he parks in the street. He had a mild stroke and suffers with various health conditions which restrict his mobility. Where will he be allowed to park?

When my girlfriend visits she parks on the street as she often comes to stay. As her car is very precious to her she likes to park opposite my house or in the visitors lay-by. If this is full where will she be able to park?

My dog is booked to have an operation to repair her L cruciate knee ligament. X-rays proved the R cruciate to be damaged also. As such she will be in rehabilitation for many weeks and most likely 3-6 months. I will need to park adjacent to my house to load her in and out of my car. I'll need to do this on numerous occasions weekly for the foreseeable future.

I own a number of cars, many of which are stored away from my home. I do however have some rare and precious cars which are registered to my address and for insurance purposes they must stay here overnight either in the garage, on the driveway or the street. If you go ahead with these plans you will be invalidating my insurance policies. I will hold Northumberland County council liable for any increase in my insurance premiums or shortfalls in my cover if I suffer a loss/theft and am not appropriately covered due to Northumberland County Councils actions.

Thank you for writing to us. We acknowledge receipt of your objection to the above matter dated 10.12.2020.

https://www.northumberland.gov.uk/Highways/Roads/Traffic.aspx. Under Section 2 'Traffic Regulation Order: under consultation (Intend)' the proposal for The Croft & South Farm can be found. The Intend Notice has also been posted on site and was published in the News Post Leader on 26.11.2020.

We are sorry to read of your current circumstances and offer our sympathies. We will take all of your comments into consideration before a formal decision is made on whether or not to proceed with the proposals once the advertising period ends on 17.12.2020. At the time of writing we cannot advise of an exact timescale for this decision but will contact you once this has been made.

Residents would be entitled to a residents' and visitors permit to park in the street and loading/unloading would still be permitted, but parking would be prohibited in the signed area without a valid permit on show and anyone without one must therefore park elsewhere.
