Proposed 20 MPH Speed Restriction U9549 Hall Close Area of Cramlington

Purpose of Report

This report sets out the background to the proposed implementation of a 20 MPH speed restriction in U9549 Hall Close Area of Cramlington, including: Doxford Place, Alexandra Way, Adderston Avenue and Allensgreen.

Recommendations

It is recommended the changes to the speed restrictions in the U9549 Hall Close Area of Cramlington are introduced.

Key Issues

- 1. The changes to a 20 MPH speed restriction to complement the existing speed limit on the remainder of Hall Close Estate
- 2. This location would benefit from reduced vehicle speeds where Vulnerable Road Users (VRUs) are present i.e. key walking and cycle route to Hareside Primary School.
- 3. The scheme is supported by local County Councillor Swinburn and Cramlington Town Council.

Background

Introduction of 20 MPH Speed Restriction changes to U9549 Hall Close Area of Cramlington

The introduction of the speed limit changes in the area of Hall Close Cramlington including: Doxford Place, Alexandra Way, Adderston Avenue and Allensgreen forms part of the 2021/22 Local Transport Plan.

This new speed limit will complement the existing 20 MPH speed limit on the adjacent parts of this estate which include Doddington Drive and Anton Place.


This estate is a major route for pupils to both Hareside Primary and Cramlington Learning Village. In addition to Cramlington's network of footpaths and cycleways, the speed reduction on these sections of highway, it is anticipated we will create a cleaner, safer environment for all road users.

To facilitate these changes, the new speed limits will be included in the new Traffic Regulation Order (TROM_225) with revocation of existing Orders where applicable and road marking and signage changes.

Details of the proposals are shown on the plan at Appendix A.

NCC Officers have worked closely with the local County Councillor, Mark Swinburn and the local Town Council on this scheme.





Northumbria Police, other emergency services and relevant statutory consultees will be notified of these amendments as part of the process for making the permanent Orders.
