Proposed Introduction of No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions on the A192 adjacent to Peacock Gap Morpeth

Purpose of Report

This report sets out the background to the proposed introduction of new No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions on the A192 Pottery Bank adjacent to a new private housing development at Peacock Gap, Morpeth.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the proposed No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions (Double Yellow Lines) on A192 Pottery Bank, Morpeth are implemented.

Key Issues

- 1. The new restrictions are required to facilitate the flow of traffic and visibility adjacent to the new housing development.
- 2. The scheme has been subject to full planning approval.

Background

The proposed introduction of new no waiting restrictions are required following a planning application for a new private housing development adjacent to A192 Pottery Bank Morpeth. The existing restrictions will no longer be appropriate due to the construction of this new estate and junction layout.

These proposals have been discussed and assessed by the NCC Highway Improvements Team. It is intended that the proposed scheme will compliment the existing restrictions by extending the double yellow lines northwards to the new development, in addition to regulatory road markings, thereby, preventing any parking and obscuring visibility at the junction. The implementation of the no waiting restrictions are supported by NCC Parking Services, who will also carry out any enforcement necessary.

The construction works on site have commenced and will be completed in 2022. These changes to the no waiting restrictions are a condition of a formal planning application.

The proposed no waiting restrictions extending the double yellow lines northwards to the new development are detailed on the overall plan of the new junction layout shown in Appendix A.
