### PROPOSED PARKING RESTRICTIONS, U2012 THE WYNDING, BAMBURGH

**Cabinet Member: Councillor John Riddle** 

### **Purpose of Report**

To consider a proposal to provide 'No Waiting at Any Time' parking restrictions in The Wynding, Bamburgh.

#### Recommendations

It is recommended that the proposed parking restrictions are implemented.

#### Key Issues

- Indiscriminate parking is causing problems along The Wynding.
- The issue is a priority for Bamburgh Parish Council and the local ward member.

# Background

- 1. Concerns have been raised by Bamburgh Parish Council and the local ward Member about indiscriminate parking in The Wynding.
- 2. The Wynding is a single-track road that runs northwest along the coast from Bamburgh village centre for a distance of just over 1km. It is located within the Northumberland Coast Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB).
- 3. The road provides access to two off-street car parks, some limited roadside parking, a small number of residential properties and the golf club. It provides direct access to the coast and is therefore popular with visitors. At busy times the car parks are full and vergeside parking takes place. This causes significant disruption and obstruction in the narrow road.
- 4. Double yellow lines have previously been provided in the southern section of The Wynding nearest the village to prevent roadside parking and encourage vehicles to park in the car parks. Problem parking during the main visitor periods is still taking place in the remainder of the road, however.
- 5. Statutory consultees were therefore consulted on a proposal to provide further double yellow lines, as shown in the diagram, below. Restrictions are proposed mainly on the west side of the road. Birdsmouth fencing is currently in place on the east side so verge parking is not possible.



- 6. Three responses were received. All were in favour of the proposed parking restrictions. A summary of the responses is shown in Appendix A.
- 7. One respondent stated that double yellow lines should be provided on both sides of the road. However, as mentioned above, birdsmouth fencing on the east side currently prevents parking. Given the sensitive location within the AONB, it also means the Council can minimise the visual intrusion of the scheme.
- 8. Both Bamburgh Parish Council and the local Ward Member are in favour of the proposal.
- 9. It is therefore recommended that the proposed parking restrictions are implemented.
