4. Matters Arising & Actions to include Chair's Update:

Actions from 18th July LAG meeting:

Ongoing action from 20th June for IH to organise a meeting with Janice Rose and Richard Wearmouth (NCC Councillor) to discuss rural development and the gap in the LEADER RC&A - IH and David Baird take forward

Page 6 - SC's comment - Alternative proposal that LAG be advised of any FAs coming forward for appraisal which are asking for more than 20% over the EOI request so LAG can consider an appropriate intervention rate

5. RPA LEADER Bulletin - 16:

DB - The accountable body has received confirmation from the RPA that the 22% uplift for Running Coast and Animation (RC&A) which is LEADER staff / LAG programme costs has been finally approved and signed off by ministers. LEADER staff contracts are to be extended from March to December 2019.

Can look to consider spending less on RC&A and more on projects as the revaluation of sterling for the programme is now 0.88 Euro, revalued from 31st July

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2018 which means there is sufficient allocation to approve projects in the pipeline. There is underspend from final claimed projects but we require confirmation from the RPA as to whether underspends go back into the pot. RPA has suggested other possible mechanisms for reallocation

- Internal Reallocation within the same Accountable Body and as we are the AB for both NULAG and Coast & Lowlands there is no internal reallocation
- Voluntary Surrender of funds nationally some LAGs are underspending so if a LEADER groups thinks it is unlikely to spend its full allocation they would complete a Variation Request form and submit it by 19th September, 2018
- Funding Required for extra projects RPA will check status on DORA on the 12th September 2018, if there are more projects than allocation a LAG could bid for underspend but Coast & Lowlands are not in that position

The government has extended other EU funding programmes to March 2020 but not LEADER. LAGs can submit a case to extend deadline which is currently March 2019 for projects, the projects can claim up to the end of December 2019 Other funding streams coming forward:

- North of Tyne Devolution
- Borderlands a business case to go to the government by Autumn
- Growth Programme

AW - How will this impact on the EOI Reserve List?

DB - LAG can look again at overcommitting, waiting on RPA regarding recycled funds. Up to LAG to decide, perhaps up to £30,000?

AW - With RC&A at 22%, what is the start date?

DB - Not back dated, 22% of overall programme budget

RB - What funds will replace RDPE (Rural Development Programme for England)?

DB - Shared Prosperity Fund and other government sources but may take upto a couple of years

6. Programme Officers Report:

IH - Gave Programme Officers report and informed LAG of current project budget commitments.

Asked that LAG agree to consider project applications on the basis of figures as of 15th August 2018 that the LAG has issued GFAs totalling £1,442,634.08 (88.4% of target spend) with a balance of £184,901.92 remaining to commit against original allocation

Note - LAG approved and agreed Budget profile

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IH - Sensible to review EOI Reserve list at next LAG meeting diaried for 19th September 2018, due to programme time frame

AW - LAG need to see available firm budget allocation for that meeting

SC - Would the programme officer have an idea of what EOIs can progress quickly?

IH - Will contact EOIs on reserve list and enquire if applications are still coming forward

DB - Realism is still criteria due to programme time scales

AW - Some EOIs may not have a realistic time scales. Alnwick Arch Climbing Centre, where is this based?

IH - Unfortunately had issue with proposed property as could not secure a 5 year lease, the applicant is enthusiastic about the project

a.Post Driver

LEADER Priority Theme 2 - Support for Micro Enterprise

Total Project Cost - £13,500.00

LEADER Grant Request - £5,400.00

Summary - The aim of the project is to invest in a post driver machine for HW Curry & Sons, a local fencing contractor. This will enable the business to bid for larger contracts.

Grant is sought to purchase the new machine which will increase business productivity enabling 1.5 FTE to be created.

Full Application was approved by LAG votes through written deposition Technical Appraisal and Written Deposition forms dated and signed by Alex Wallace, Vice Chair

b. Zero Tillage
DORA Ref:109391
LEADER Priority Theme 1 - Support for Farm Productivity
Total Project Cost - £86,490.00
LEADER Grant Request - £17,289.00

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Summary - The aim of the project is to fund a specialised zero till crop drilling machine for a farm in north Northumberland. This sort of drill helps to preserve soil structure reducing loss of water and nutrients from the soil improving the quality of the land.

Grant is sought to purchase the new drill, increase farm productivity, create 0.5 FTE job and introduce a new technique to the business and, by offering a contracting service, will increase business turnover and sustainability.

Full Application - Approved

LAG Noted: LAG members are very keen that benefits of this approach to crop establishment are evaluated and published more widely. This can be discussed further at the project evaluation stage

c. Community Transport Bell View
DORA Ref:109718
LEADER Priority Theme 4 - Support for Rural Services
Total Project Cost - £51,181.00
LEADER Grant Request - £40,944.80

Summary - The project will fund the purchase of a new purpose built fully accessible minibus to continue, increase and improve Bel View's community transport provision across the most rural and isolated parts of North Northumberland. Meeting the identified future needs of the charity, its trading subsidiaries and beneficiaries.

AW - Asked LAG members to vote if they wanted to discuss this full application as the technical appraisal has not been signed off by the RPA
