c. Indoor Riding Arena

Summary - The aim of the project is to construct a large indoor riding arena at Swinhoe Farm Riding Centre. This will enable the facility to operate all year around expanding the capacity of the business through numbers of riding lessons and exams taken. It will also enable the venue to be hired all year around by the pony clubs or events etc.

Grant is sought to purchase and install the building and riding surface and undertake associated groundworks and electrical works. This will enable 2.5 FTE to be created, wage bill to be increased and increase the turnover of the riding school.
