# Northumberland County Council Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way For the County of Northumberland

#### **Definitive Map Modification Order (No 10) 2021**

The above Order, made on 17<sup>th</sup> December 2021, was confirmed on 4<sup>th</sup> November 2022 and will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:-

## Restricted Byway No 45 (Parish of Hepple)

Adding thereto a restricted byway, from the C172 road, 135 metres south-west of Flotterton Cottages (O.S. Grid Ref NT 9967 0242), in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 75 metres, to join alleged Restricted Byway No 13 in the Parish of Snitter, 155 metres west of Flotterton Cottages (NT 9963 0248).

#### **Restricted Byway No 13 (Parish of Snitter)**

Adding thereto a restricted byway, from alleged Restricted Byway No 45 in the Parish of Hepple, 155 metres west of Flotterton Cottages (O.S. Grid Ref NT 9963 0248), in a general north-westerly direction for a distance of 1305 metres, to join the U4025 road (alleged Byway Open to All Traffic No 12), 85 metres north of Plainfield (NT 9898 0341).

### Footpath No 1 (Parish of Snitter)

The Definitive Statement for this existing public right of way will be amended to reflect the addition of the 'new' Restricted Byway No 13.

The Order became operative on 4<sup>th</sup> November 2022 but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provisions contained in it, on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation has not been complied with in relation to the Orde, he or she may, within six weeks from 24<sup>th</sup> November 2022 make an application to the High Court for that purpose.
