#5 TELL ME ALL ABOUT T-LEVELS

T-Levels are new courses coming in September 2020, following on from GCSEs and equivalent to three A-Levels.

These two-year courses have been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares you for work.

T Levels will offer you a mixture of classroom learning and 'on-the-job' experience during an industry placement of at least 315 hours (approximately 45 days).

They will provide you with the knowledge and experience you need to open the door into skilled employment, further study or a higher apprenticeship.

Supported internships are for young people (aged 16-24) with learning difficulties and/or disabilities and who want to move into employment with plenty of support.

The purpose of the internship is to raise aspirations and improve the likelihood of a young person with learning disabilities achieving paid employment through the provision of supported work placements.

Northumberland County Council works closely with local special schools, organising and running industry days for their students. This includes a workplace visit and presentations about working for Northumberland County Council.

We also invite young people who are already on internships within the council along to the industry day to talk about their experiences.

Young people on an internship also benefit from a 1-2-1 support worker for half a day a week and also a supervisor within the workplace who has received relevant training to support the young person.
