# A quick reference guide to waste disposal for schools

- School waste is not permitted at any of the Northumberland Household Waste Recovery Centres.
- Any school or organisation transporting waste away from a school site must have an up-to-date Waste Carriers Licence and the correct insurance to do this.

#### **Waste Carriers Licences and insurance**

- Any school or organisation transporting waste away from a school site must have an up-todate Waste Carriers Licence and the correct insurance to do this.
- To check if a Waste Carrier is registered or to register your school as a Waste Carrier, please see www.gov.uk/waste-carrier-or-broker-registration
- If you cannot find an organisation on the register, please contact them directly for the relevant paperwork.

#### **Duty of Care**

- All businesses are required by law to store, transport and safely dispose of the waste they generate.
- Waste on your site must be stored safely to prevent it causing pollution or harming anyone. For example, in schools, waste electrical items such as fluorescent tubes must be stored in a special container until collected.
- Make sure Duty of Care paperwork / Waste Transfer notes are completed for each company or organisation collecting waste from your school.
