5. Fund Launched to Transform Transport Systems in English City Regions

6. Funding for Projects that Increase the Emotional Wellbeing of Disadvantaged

The 'Mercers' Wellbeing Initiative' is a small grants programme to increase the emotional wellbeing of individuals through participation in creativity and the arts or through access to nature and the outdoors. Grants from £20,000 to £50,000 for up to two years are available to not for profit organisations, community groups, charities, church groups and those of other faiths that are working within their Church and Communities programme. Clubs, local authorities and educational institutions (schools, colleges and universities, etc.) have the opportunity to come together with other local partner organisations to apply for capital funding to create a community tennis network in their area.
