	a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) List here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
	As per Northumberland County Council's Vision Statement, it is our intention to be committed to offering a high quality, well managed entertainment, cultural and community venue operating within a safe, orderly and attractive environment; valued by those who live here, work here and those who come to visit. We aim to support the community charities, local businesses and have a welcoming area for all.
	b) The prevention of crime and disorder
	There will be a zero tolerance to drug use on the premises and anyone suspected of being under the influence of drugs will not be served and asked to leave. There will be a conscious effort to stop serving anyone who appears to have reached their alcohol limit. There will be CCTV in operation internally and externally and any disorder that can be dealt with at the time, will be. Footage will be used after the fact for any police requirements but also to refuse future entry.
	c) Public safety
	Staff will be trained to the highest standards. Escape routes clearly marked and unobstructed at all times. There will be a defibrillator on the external of the building available for the community.
	d) The prevention of public nuisance
	The building will be have air-conditioning so at no point will windows be open limiting any noise/smell. Food waste will be quarantined inside the building and disposed of privately, thus ensuring the external of the building remains clear and clean.

No parking signs will be erected on the private road to the side of the building and as per advice from local councilors, visitors will be directed to the public car park 100 yards to the rear of the property. Parking anywhere else will not be

There will be signage inside to ask customers to respect the neighbourhood when leaving the premises and again, anyone

seen not to be adhering to this will not be welcomed back.

There will be a waiting area inside the main doors for anyone who has book a taxi to reduce noise from waiting outside but also to ensure they are ready to leave as soon as their vehicle arrives to keep the main road free.

e) The protection of children from harm

A Challenge 25 shall be operated where only Passport, Driving License or Proof of Age Card will be accepted. Minors will only be allowed in under supervision and will have to leave by 9pm. Anyone in charge of a minor who is perceived to be close to intoxication will not be served.

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience
 does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
 audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
 licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
