Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

Our venue is a family-oriented wedding destination that prioritises a safe, welcoming environment for all guests. We actively encourage attendance and participation from guests of all ages, fostering a joyful and inclusive atmosphere throughout each event. The venue is not open to members of the public and attendance is by guest invite only of the wedding party/organiser.

To ensure the smooth and responsible operation of the premises, we will appoint a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) who is both experienced and well-versed in managing licensed venues. The DPS plays a key role in overseeing all licensable activities and maintaining compliance with relevant regulations.

We maintain a sufficient number of trained staff on-site at all times. Each member of our team is fully trained for their specific roles, ensuring professional service, guest safety, and adherence to licensing requirements.

We are fully committed to upholding the four licensing objectives:

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder
- 2. Public safety
- 3. The prevention of public nuisance
- 4. The protection of children from harm

All operational policies, staff training protocols, and record-keeping systems have been developed to support these objectives and to ensure a safe, compliant, and welcoming environment for all guests.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Staff Training and Record-Keeping Procedures

All operational staff will receive documented training at the commencement of their employment, covering their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. This training will include, but is not limited to:

- The retail sale of alcohol
- The venue's age verification policy
- · Conditions attached to the Premises Licence
- Permitted licensable activities
- The four licensing objectives
- · The venue's authorised opening times

Records of this training will be maintained for a minimum period of one year and will be made available immediately upon reasonable request by any Responsible Authority. Refresher training will be provided and documented at intervals not exceeding 12 months to ensure ongoing compliance and awareness.

Refusals and Incident Recording

The premises will maintain both a **Refusals Register** and an **Incident Report Register**, which will be used to record:

- Any refusal of alcohol sales to individuals who are underage or appear intoxicated
- Incidents of anti-social behaviour
- Any ejections from the premises

Each entry will be retained for at least one year from the date of the respective incident. These records will also be made available immediately upon reasonable request by any Responsible Authority.

c) Public safety

To ensure a safe and secure environment for all guests, staff, the following health and safety protocols are in place:

Routine Premises Checks

- The premises will be regularly checked for broken glass, spillages, and potential safety hazards throughout the duration of events.
- All rubbish, used glasses, and bottles will be removed promptly and regularly to prevent obstructions, slips, or injuries.

Staff Training and Emergency Preparedness

- All staff will receive training in health, safety, and emergency procedures, with records of this
 training maintained and updated as necessary.
- An Incident Log will be kept to document any safety-related occurrences or accidents. These records will be retained for at least 12 months and made available upon request to a Responsible Authority.

Capacity and Staffing

- The number of attendees for each event is agreed in advance, and staffing levels are arranged accordingly to ensure safety and effective management.
- Staff are always present on-site prior to guest arrival to conduct final safety checks and prepare the venue.

Alcohol Responsibility and Legal Awareness

The licence holder will ensure that all staff are aware of their legal and social responsibilities, particularly in relation to the sale of alcohol and the protection of children from harm.

Fire Safety

- All fire safety equipment and measures on the premises will be regularly maintained and kept in full working order.
- A formal Fire Risk Assessment will be conducted regularly in accordance with the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 to assess and uphold fire safety standards.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The premises are committed to ensuring that no nuisance is caused to local residents or the surrounding area as a result of activities on site. The following measures will be implemented to actively prevent public nuisance:

Noise Management

- No outdoor entertainment or amplified music will take place after 22:00 hours.
- After 22:00 hours, all doors and windows will be kept closed, except for the immediate access and egress of persons, to minimise noise escape.

No noise or vibration shall emanate from the premises that may cause a nuisance to nearby properties or be transmitted through the structure of the building.

Lighting and External Areas

 All outdoor lighting will be switched off by 01:30 hours to prevent light pollution affecting neighbouring properties.

Signage and Guest Communication

"Please leave quietly and respect our neighbours" signs will be displayed in prominent locations
throughout the premises, especially at exit points, to encourage considerate behaviour from
quests leaving the venue.

Alcohol Management

 Alcoholic drinks shall not be removed from the premises by guests, in order to minimise the risk of associated noise or litter.

e) The protection of children from harm

The premises are committed to ensuring the safety and welfare of children at all times. The following measures are in place to promote the licensing objective of protecting children from harm:

Age Verification and Alcohol Sales

- The premises operate a strict Challenge 25 policy. Any individual who appears to be under the age of 25 will be required to produce acceptable photographic identification (such as a passport, driving licence, or PASS-accredited proof of age card) before being served alcohol.
- No alcohol sales will be made to any person under the age of 18 under any circumstances.
- All staff involved in the sale of alcohol will receive training on age-restricted sales, including how
 to handle refusals. This training will be documented and refreshed annually, with records retained
 for at least 12 months.

Supervision of Children

- Children attending events must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult at all times
- Children will not be permitted in areas of the premises that may present a safety risk.

Event and Activity Planning

- Events likely to attract families or children will be planned with appropriate safeguards in place, including adequate supervision, child-friendly facilities, and clear guidance for parents and guardians
- Staff will remain vigilant for signs of vulnerability, neglect, or abuse and are instructed to report
 any concerns to the appropriate authorities.

Refusals Log

 Any refusal of alcohol service to a minor will be recorded in the Refusals Register, which will be maintained for inspection and kept for at least 12 months.

hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
- For example the type of activity to be authorised, if not already stated, and give relevant further details, for example (but not exclusively) whether or not music will be amplified or unamplified.
- For example (but not exclusively), where the activity will occur on additional days during the summer months.
- For example (but not exclusively), where you wish the activity to go on longer on a particular day e.g. Christmas Eve.
- 7. Please give timings in 24 hour clock (e.g. 16.00) and only give details for the days of the week when you intend the premises to be used for the activity.
- 8. If you wish people to be able to consume alcohol on the premises, please tick 'on the premises'. If you wish people to be able to purchase alcohol to consume away from the premises, please tick 'off the premises'. If you wish people to be able to do both, please tick 'both'.
- 9. Please give information about anything intended to occur at the premises or ancillary to the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children, regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups or the presence of gaming machines.
- 10. Please list here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
- 11. The application form must be signed.
- 12. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
- 13. Where there is more than one applicant, each of the applicants or their respective agent must sign the application form.
- 14. This is the address which we shall use to correspond with you about this application.
- 15. Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:
 - A licence may not be issued to an individual or an individual in a partnership which is not a limited liability partnership who is resident in the UK who:
 - · does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
 - is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have the right to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

They do this in one of two ways:

- by providing with this application, copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant has provided, to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) as per information published on gov.uk and in guidance.
- by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Home Office online right to work checking service.

As an alternative to providing a copy of original documents, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth, will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
