RL - Noted for LAG that OA Sleepy Hare, approved by LAG to FA at May's meeting had similarities to the OA Action Chase, declined to progress at April's meeting. LAG had seen merit in Action Chase. Both OA's were circulated to LAG members to look for consistency in approach, challenging for LAG

The OA assessment stage is not just about eligibility. Summary - The project will create an Organic Poultry laying unit for 12,000 hens in

IR - Is it all happening at Easington, a new build?

LF - Specialist build, does need planning permissions. Will be well hidden and is low lying

SP - Will eggs all go to wholesaler?

LF - Yes

JO - Who will be employed?

LF - As this is a specific unit will require specialised employment

JO - Do the birds get out?

LF - Yes, trained from young as soon as light comes on, they are free to get out and roam around

AB - 75%, can fill gaps with friends/colleagues

JO - Size of accommodation?

AB - Main has 4 bedrooms, second 2 bedrooms and third has 3 bedrooms

JL - Have secured planning permission, status of land purchase?

AB - Currently negotiating purchase price

Summary - The project will remove scrub and invasive regrowth on steep grassy banks (which are inaccessible by tractor), by means of purchasing a remote control robotic flailing machine and associated specialist transportation trailer

- FD Banks have been eroded over years, narrow gorge. If it gets overgrown is lost to woodland

- RL Environment Agency has one
- AW What type of warranty and what about spare parts?
- FD Operator specific. 12 month warranty on new piece of machinery, maybe once every three years maintenance . Currently spraying gorge from back of a quad

- FD Land is within Stewardship from October end of February

Summary - A new business start-up aiming to redevelop a derelict farmhouse with four barns (outbuildings) and 10 acres of land. The applicant's intention is to: create a permanent farmhouse residence; a 3 room bed & breakfast (in the farmhouse); redevelop the outbuildings to form 3 holiday cottages; 'Northumbrian' landscaped area (1 of each accommodation type will be wheelchair friendly). 2.5 FTE jobs are forecast to be created

FT - I will run it, 1 employee for breakfasts then there's maintenance for buildings

FT - Sons business, I am Company Secretary
