a.Precision Beef Farming

**DORA Ref:106488** 

**LEADER Priority Theme 1 - Support for Farm Productivity** 

Total Project Cost - £138,644.84

LEADER Grant Request - £55,457.94

Project Summary - The project is to establish a Precision Beef Research facility which will complement the existing commercial beef enterprise and reinvigorate on-farm specialist research in Northumberland for both academic and commercial clients. This will run alongside investments in a new suckler cow building to accommodate 140 suckler cows and calves and other associated developments requiring an investment of £1.2million.
