Sparsity Funding Consultation and the 2022/23 National Funding Formula

1. Purpose of the Report

To provide information the Government response on the Sparsity Funding consultation exercise earlier in 2021 and the implications of this for Northumberland Schools.

The report should be considered in conjunction with the NFF update and consultation and update elsewhere on the agenda, and the associated proposals for 2022/23.

2. Recommendations

Schools Forum is asked to note the information provided and the additional £719,269 estimated funding for schools in Northumberland arising from the greater investment in sparsity at a national level.

3. Background

In November 2019 Schools Forum supported a disapplication request to the ESFA in relation to a change in methodology relating to the measurement of sparsity by road distances for 6 schools, rather than the “as the crow flies” method used at that stage by the ESFA. For 2020/21, this cost £141,308, allocated from the Schools Block DSG. We repeated this for 2021/22 and responded accordingly to the ESFA consultation held in March and April 2021. (A draft response was shared with the Schools Forum)

4. Current position

The Government response to the consultation has now been published, a copy of which is available [HERE](#) .

Key findings in the government response highlighted:

“Strong support for the policy aim and proposals in response to this consultation has reinforced the case to increase funding for small remote schools” (page 24)

Following the consultation, 3 key changes are being implemented from 2022-23:

- School sparsity distances are to be calculated by road journeys, replacing the previous “as the crow flies” methodology;
- The maximum amount of sparsity funding a school can receive has been increased from £45,000 to £55,000 for primaries and from £70,000 to £80,000 for all other schools.

- A distance taper threshold will also be introduced, meaning that schools that are marginally below the main average distance threshold of 2 or 3 miles (depending on phase) will now attract some additional funding, to reduce the changes of a “cliff edge” to sparsity funding.

It should be noted that individual school’s sparsity distances are available via Collect.

5. Financial Impact

In its response the DfE highlight that the total allocation via the sparsity factor will increase to £95 million for 2022-23, a £53million increase on the 2021/22 figure of £42m. In terms of the impact for Northumberland, figures can only be estimated at this stage but, using the indicative consultation data, this suggested that Northumberland will receive an increase of £719,269 in 2022/23 receiving in total £2.602 million of the DfE total of £95 million. A breakdown of this is attached at Appendix A.

In comparison in 2020/21 we received only £1.175 million.

This increase consists both of schools receiving funding for the first time due to the methodology change and increases for schools currently in receipt of sparsity funding.

6. Summary and Conclusions

The result of the DfE consultation on Sparsity, and the additional funding to be distributed via sparsity is beneficial to Northumberland in that it has meant we are receiving additional funding. The role of Schools Forum in supporting the original disapplication request in November 2019 is appreciated in highlighting the need to review the mechanisms by which sparsity was distributed.
