Psychological Services

Psychological Services is a team of Educational Psychologists (EP), Assistant Educational Psychologists and Trainee Educational Psychologists who work with school staff, children and families.

We work with individuals, schools and settings to help achieve better outcomes for children and young people.



We support adults involved in the lives of children and young people and work with learners to:

- Promote positive development
- Prevent additional/special educational needs and requirements developing.
- Intervene early where additional/special educational needs and requirements are identified.
- Support those with on-going additional needs and requirements.



Educational Psychologists can work at the individual level working directly with children and families, or at the group or whole school level to support schools in developing their policy and practice.

In the first instance, parents should discuss any concerns they have about their child's development or progress with the school. This will usually be with the school SENCo (Special Educational Needs Co-Ordinator).

The school will be able to explain how they are addressing the needs of the child or young person and discuss whether a referral to other services is necessary. If the school has a Service Level Agreement and feels that a request for support from Psychological Services would be helpful, the SENCo, with parental consent, will contact the school's link EP to agree the work.
