Support You and your family are not alone


Support for our foster carers sits at the heart of our service, alongside our aspirations for our children and young people.

At Northumberland we recognise that supporting our children and young people to thrive and achieve their potential requires holistic support to those around them.

We know that nothing happens in isolation - we therefore have an extensive support package on offer for our foster carers and their families, covering your emotional, practical, financial, and health needs.

Training & Development

Our training and development programme is designed to help you support the children with whatever care they need.

All foster carers receive comprehensive training, free of charge, starting with the application process. Once working as a foster carer, you and your social worker will agree on your specific training needs and set out a personal development plan. You are supported with your training by the team as well as tapping into experienced foster families. There are mandatory courses that you complete in your first year to attain the statutory national Training Support and Development Standards, along with a small number of ongoing mandatory courses each year.

Training is offered in several ways to suit the various topics you cover, including online instructor-led via Zoom, Microsoft Teams, etc, self-paced eLearning, blended learning, and bite size sessions. Getting together with foster carers and other professionals in training, meetings and support groups enhances your learning by sharing practical experiences.

> The needs of children in your care is the key driver for the types of other learning that you will choose to do in addtion to the basic programme - all supported by the teams around you and the children.

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Mockingbird

Our Mockingbird programme was launched in 2021 and is already bringing positive outcomes for cared for children, children who foster, foster carers and their wider families. Due to early successs, we are looking to develop this fostering model across the county.

The fundamental aim is to create a family and friends network of foster families who meet up like you would with sisters, uncles, friends, cousins etc. for activities, friendships and support.


The Hub Home carer could be described as the matriach / patriarch of the family. The one that

the children gravitate towards, who organises family get togethers, and also offers sleepovers. We know our Mockingbird families help alleviate the sense of isolation that foster families and cared for children can sometimes feel.

Foster Care Finances

Fostering finances are paid via direct debit on a fortnightly basis from approval. You receive a skills fee and child allowance per fostered child. From 2025, our fostering finances go through an annual cost of living review.

A band 3 carer looking after 5 and 11 year old children receives the following:

Child 1 Skills Fee = £275 Child 1 Child Allowance = £194 Child 2 Skills Fee = £275 Child 2 Child Allowance = £220
