10 things you should know about Safeguarding in Schools

	The government's definition of safeguarding in the statutory guidance Keeping Children Safe in Education (2018) is:
	 protecting children from maltreatment preventing impairment of children's health or development
	 ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with
	the provision of safe and effective care taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes
2	Reading Part One of DfE statutory guidance <u>Keeping Children Safe in</u> <u>Education</u> is a statutory requirement for all school staff and it is essential that you keep a record that this is done every year. The full document will keep your knowledge up to date.
3_	You should be familiar with your school's safeguarding policy and all of the accompanying procedures.

4	Ensure you are clear about your school's procedures for referrals if you have concerns about a child:
	Record ⇒ report ⇒ respond
5	If you have any safeguarding concerns you must report them to the Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) who will advise you on the appropriate course of action. You should ask your DSL for a progress update to ensure your concerns have been actioned.
6	All of the local authority advice for dealing with safeguarding is provided by the Local Safeguarding Children Board (LSCB) and a range of resources can be found on their webpages <u>at this link.</u>
	All referrals to Children's Services should be made to OneCall :

8	DSLs should receive annual training. In Northumberland we recommend that they attend a ½ refresher session every two years and attend contextual safeguarding training on the alternate year (ie training which is relevant to their school or local context). All staff should receive an annual update and safeguarding must be part of any induction package.
9	If you have any concerns about the behaviour of an adult in school you must contact the Designated Officer (DO). His name is Adam Hall and you can call him on 01670 623979.
10	For support with practices for safeguarding children in your school above the statutory minimum required, there is a Schools' Safeguarding service level agreement which all schools can buy into through the Education & Skills portal.
