Frankland Quartet Thursday 16th November 2023 7.30pm

The Frankland Quartet will make a welcome return to Morpeth having performed an excellent concert for us in 2021. The guartet formed in 2017, having met as colleagues at Royal Northern Sinfonia. The artists create innovative programmes, balancing familiar and newer works, with a particular focus on female composers and under-represented groups.

Our programme will open with a movement from Bach's Art of Fugue followed by Haydn's 'Sunrise' guartet. The second half will comprise Janáček's second guartet 'Intimate Letters' which is the composer's representation of his decade-long correspondence with his muse Kamila Stösslová.

The young Adelphi Quartet is rapidly making a name for itself by winning prizes at international chamber music competitions and impressing audiences around Europe. In 2021, the guartet was selected for the highly prestigious Young Classical Artists Trust scheme. The guartet formed in 2017, the musicians hailing from Belgium, Spain, the UK and Germany, to celebrate a unified joy in making music.

Their programme includes early Haydn, searing Shostakovich and Beethoven's late and monumental Op. 132 guartet.

Violinist, Iona Brown will be well known to local audiences, having played with the Royal Northern Sinfonia since 1995. As well as her busy RNS role, Iona guests with the Scottish Chamber Orchestra and the Hallé. Iona's frequent recital partner, David Murray is another stalwart of the North East musical scene, having worked as Head of Keyboard Studies at Newcastle University since 2002.

Iona's programme will start with unaccompanied Bach and continue with Franck's virtuosic sonata for violin and piano, originally written for the Polish violinist, Eugène Ysaÿe. Fittingly, our programme will continue with Ysaÿe's own Ballade from his solo violin sonata No 3, followed by two works by his pupil Henryk Wieniawski before concluding with Brahms' last sonata for violin and piano.
