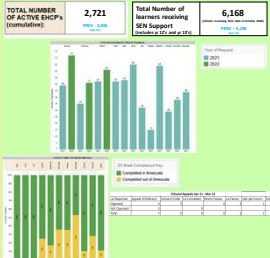


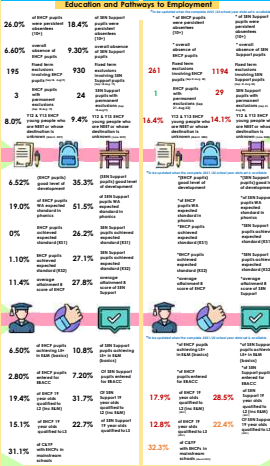
Northumberland's SEND Outcomes

 N.B. All children or young people are eligible for the SEND Register if a person, disability, illness, or barrier to learning meets the criteria for SEND. This includes children or young people who are not currently on the SEND Register but who are eligible for SEND support. The SEND Register is a public record of children or young people with SEND.

Early Help & Social Work

When comparing the data for Northumberland to the national average, the data shows that 91.4% of SEND pupils received early help support, compared to 81.0% nationally. This data is based on the number of SEND pupils who received early help support, compared to the number of SEND pupils who were eligible for early help support.

This chart shows the number of children with SEND who received early help support, compared to the number of children with SEND who were eligible for early help support. The data is based on the number of children who received early help support, compared to the number of children who were eligible for early help support.

The information below has been generated by looking at social work related cases that resulted. The data is produced on the basis of the number of social work cases, and not the number of children who received social work services. The data is based on the effectiveness of the service, to bring about a change in the child's circumstances.



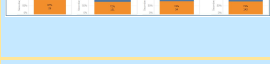
Average Score Based on the Effectiveness of the Service

Community Inclusion and Independent Living (18-25 yr olds)

83.0% of SEND pupils were assessed for community inclusion and independent living needs. 93.1% of SEND pupils were assessed for community inclusion and independent living needs.



Listening to Children, Young People & Parents

The SEND Register for SENDs is a public record of children or young people with SEND. The data is based on the number of children or young people who are on the SEND Register, compared to the number of children or young people who are eligible for the SEND Register.
