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Training Strategy

This training offer is available to anyone working with children and families in Northumberland.

Attendance is free-of-charge for all delegates, but non-attendance without prior cancellation will be charged at a rate of £50 per half day, in accordance with the Northumberland Strategic Safeguarding Partnership charging policy.

The purpose of this programme is to provide workforce development opportunities for professionals across the statutory and voluntary sectors in order to support direct work with children, young people and families.

All courses are developed and delivered by local professionals as part of a partnership approach to sharing knowledge and expertise across agencies. Governance of the training programme is provided via the NSCB in order to ensure quality standards and application of local policies and procedures.

The underlying theme of the Early Help Training Strategy is 'enabling and supporting change' at three levels:

- in the lives of children and families
- in professional practice of individual staff
- in agency approaches to working with children and families.

The training programme is divided into four sections:

- 1. Process when and how to use the Early Help Assessment process effectively
- 2. Tools and techniques approaches and resources which can be used to facilitate change in a range of situations
- 3. Issue-based courses to develop understanding and confidence to work with specific issues and recognise the role of specialist services in each area.

The programme has also been developed to support the objectives of Northumberland's Resilience Strategy, a partnership plan to address the health and emotional well-being of children and young people across the county.

For most of the courses in this brochure, application is via Learning Together (ncc.learningpool.com). For those learning events which have a different application process, this is outlined on the course information page.

NB: For health professionals, this Early Help training offer provides continuing professional development but does not meet the criteria for mandatory level 3 multi-agency safeguarding training which must still be accessed via the NSCB Multi-Agency Training Programme.







Event Overview

Disagreements and differences of opinion are normal in family life and only become a problem if they are unresolved or create ongoing tension between family members. This can often be exacerbated if parents are separated or divorced.

This one-day course has been developed locally, using materials from the government's Reducing Parental Conflict training programme. It will raise awareness of the impact of unresolved parental conflict on children and identify techniques for supporting parents to resolve differences in a healthy way. It will also emphasise the difference between parental disagreement and domestic abuse as these need very different approaches from professionals.

Event Overview

There is now consistent evidence about the importance of a secure attachment relationship in the development of a child's emotional health and well-being. Early life experience, especially the early caregiver/child relationship has a significant impact on brain development.

Recognition and understanding of attachment issues and appropriate intervention is fundamental to children achieving their full potential, either by preventing difficulties arising or by building resilience where difficulties have already arisen.

The multi-agency Attachment and Resilience Training (ART) Group has developed a range of training to ensure the key messages of research are disseminated across the Northumberland Children's Workforce. The Introduction to Attachment provides a baseline of knowledge for anyone working with children, young people and families.




