Katie said her greatest achievement was passing her GCSE's and A levels and getting a job and working. She did a world challenge a few years back, she has passed her driving test, she learned Spanish with Ginny.

Katie was asked what advice you would give families: She said just be yourself, don't be embarrassed and don't be afraid. Do not let your deafness hold you back, she said to mention to people straight away that you are deaf, you are no different to anyone else.

Katie said that Sensory Support Service should keep doing what they are doing.

Judith said that not to let your deafness overcome everything else, and do not let anyone treat them any different. She said schools could make things better by using script and subtitles and by teachers asking the child or young person if they need any more help.
