This course covers a diverse range of job roles and occupational areas within the childcare and education setting.  There is no formal assessment but your progress and achievement will be recognised and recorded by your teacher throughout the course.

Who is this course for?

Those who are currently working as a teaching assistant that wish to progress to a Higher Level Teaching Assistant status.

What will I study? (Key modules or content)

Gain the essential knowledge and understanding required when analysing and addressing the different challenges that classroom assistants are likely to face.

Through the completion of this course, you will gain an understanding of the different requirements involved, when working with individuals and small groups, as well as gaining an essential insight into supporting pupils with special educational needs (SEN).

To successfully achieve this qualification you must complete seven mandatory units:

- Professional Knowledge and Development for Higher Level Teaching Assistants
- Child Development and Well Being
- Supporting Children and Young People with Special Educational Needs
- Promoting Children and Young People's Positive Behaviour
- Working with Individual and Groups of Learners
- Positive Working Relationships
- Curriculum planning, Monitoring
- Delivery and Assessment

The qualification will be assessed through a combination of assignments and observations of teaching or training.

Learners are required to be working within a school as a teaching assistant.

Requirements of the course (e.g. kit/uniform info)

During placement, learners will need support from a professional within the real work environment who will be required to complete professional development records.

On successful achievement of the Focus Awards Level 4 Certificate For Higher Level Teaching Assistants (RQF) learners may wish to progress onto becoming a teacher.
