This two-day Chainsaw Maintenance and Cross-cutting course will provide you with the appropriate techniques and safety guidelines to ensure that you are not only confident when using a chainsaw but also aware of relevant health and safety guidelines making sure you stay protected.

The course will include:

- An overview of the chainsaw and maintenance equipment
- Maintaining the saw chain
- Maintaining the guide bar
- Power unit maintenance
- Starting the chainsaw
- Pre-cutting tests
- Cross-cutting timber.

This course aims to run over 5 consecutive days with the 6th day allocated for your assessment. You will be assessed through a National Proficiency Test and a Council registered assessor at a date to be arranged.

You must have completed the Chainsaw Maintenance & Crosscutting course and due to the nature of the course, you will need to have a reasonable level of fitness.
