## **Pupil Premium Update**

(Data is taken from Pupil premium: allocations and conditions of grant 2016 to 2017 - DfE: July 2016

#### 1. The Position in Northumberland

### 2. Primary pupils in Northumberland

2.1. 23.4% of primary pupils are eligible for PP. This is the eighth lowest proportion of primary PP pupils in the North of England (out of 35) and the lowest in the North East (out of 12). Northumberland is ranked 86 out of 152 local authorities nationally (highest proportion being 1st).

#### 3. Secondary pupils in Northumberland

3.1. 25.2% of secondary pupils are eligible for PP. This is the sixth lowest proportion of secondary PP pupils in the North of England and the lowest in the North East . Northumberland is ranked 104 out of 152 local authorities nationally.

#### 4. Service Children in Northumberland

4.1. Northumberland has the second highest number of service children in the North and the highest in the North East. Northumberland educates 18% of the service children in the North East.

#### 5. Post-LAC pupils in Northumberland

5.1. Northumberland has the sixth highest number of service children in the North and the second highest in the North East. Northumberland educates 15% of the Post-LAC pupils in the North East.

#### 6. Pupil Premium Plus for Looked After Children in Northumberland

6.1. Northumberland has the ninth lowest number of Pupil Premium Plus pupils in the North and the fifth lowest in the North East. Northumberland educates 7% of the Pupil Premium Plus pupils in the North East.

### 7. Geographical Spread of PP monies in Northumberland

7.1. 14 primary settings receive over £100,000 in primary PP funding. The majority of these schools are in South East Northumberland. 12 secondary settings receive over £100,000 in secondary PP funding. These schools are more widely spread across the county, however there is still a concentration in South East Northumberland.
