

Behaviour on School Transport

The way you behave says a lot about <u>you</u>! School pupils and college students travelling on contracted transport represent their family, the school/college and the County Council and it is important to understand poor behaviour reflects badly on everyone concerned.

Students who have a right to travel on school transport also have a responsibility to behave appropriately, failure to do so could result in you being excluded from using school transport in the future.

Do's and Don'ts

- Stand back from the road and wait until the vehicle comes to a complete stop before boarding.
- Board the vehicle in single file and behave in an orderly manner.
- You must show your permit when accessing the transport. Continuous failure to do so may result in you being refused transport.
- Always use the correct vehicle and board/alight at the stop identified on your travel permit.
- Find a seat, sit down and fasten your seatbelt.
- Sit one person per seat and remain seated whilst the bus is moving, do not change seats during the journey.
- No bullying, fighting, shouting, smoking, spiting, swearing, vandalism or verbal abuse.
 - No food or drink to be consumed on the transport.
 - Do not distract the driver, respect that they have a responsible job.
 - Do not throw things inside the bus or out the window
 - Respect all other passengers travelling on the bus and other road users.
 - Do as the driver/escort asks you.
 - Take care of your permit; it will cost £10.00 to replace.
