	The vision was reviewed considering public opinion from the consultation.	
	91% of all respondents from the public consultation agreed broadly with the vision as developed by the board at previous meetings. It was agreed that the feedback was largely supportive of the vision and had clearly signalled that no significant changes were required	
	The board's vision remained as below:	
	"Enhancing Alnwick's long-term future as an outstanding place to live, work and visit."	
4	Review of Strategic Objectives The strategic objectives were reviewed considering public opinion from the consultation. 93% of respondents agreed with the objectives broadly which demonstrated support for all four existing strategic objectives and underpinning values. However, the board highlighted the significant number of responses (131) which highlighted issues around public transport and connectivity.
