3	Consultation Review – Peter Mawer	

	A review of the consultation was presented by PM. The presentation aimed to demonstrate the key findings from the public consultation. These findings would then be used to review the vision and strategic objectives agreed by the board at the previous meeting.	
	It was agreed that the presentation would be shared amongst the board. The board agreed to keep the contents confidential until the consultation was published on 30 May 2022	PM
	The board discussed the vision in light of the public's response to the consultation and agreed that it could be 'tightened up'. The vision for the Haltwhistle Borderlands Place Programme going forward was agreed as:	
	"By 2031 Haltwhistle will be a vibrant, growing town recognised as a 'must see' destination by visitors to the area. The town will offer day and night-time activities for all age groups and be attractive to residents and visitors. New innovative businesses will be drawn to the town, complementing and developing existing businesses."	
	The board then discussed the Strategic Objectives in light of the public's response to the consultation and agreed that, with 98% support, there would be no changes to the objectives.
