1. Business Support

1.1 North East Growth Hub

Financial assistance and related support are available for North East based businesses in Northumberland, Tyne and Wear and County Durham undertaking business development projects. For further details click here

1.2 North of Tyne High streets Innovation Programme – Accelerate Ashington

Accelerate Ashington is a brand-new package of support services available to local businesses currently trading and operating within Ashington. The programme consists of two elements: Digital and Start-up. For further information click bere

1.3 North of Tyne Inward Investment

Are you a business looking to make a first investment in Newcastle, North Tyneside or Northumberland? The North of Tyne has £10m available to support businesses looking to invest and create jobs and may be able to contribute to up to 10% of your costs. Grants are available between £100,000 up to a maximum of £1million for foreign or UK owned businesses making a first investment in the area. For further information click here

1.4 North of Tyne Combined Authority – Crowdfund Noth of Tyne

Set up to give local people the opportunity to create and fund projects which celebrate and improve our local area, encouraging projects to raise a proportion of their funding via direct donations from local people, groups and businesses. It is an initiative which provides grants of between £1k and £30k to community groups, businesses, charities and individuals, to top up their crowdfunded projects. It will run until June 2025. 1.5 Northumberland Small Business Service

The Northumberland Small Business Service (NSBS) is a fully funded service that delivers a range of business support services to individuals and micro and small sized businesses across Northumberland. The service has a particular focus on supporting rural businesses to unlock the barriers to growth as well as supporting individuals to start a new business. The friendly, approachable, and dedicated team are on hand to bridge the economic gap for rural businesses and provide a one stop shop for businesses or individuals looking for support from the service or to help them understand about the wider support available across the North of Tyne area. Included within this package of support the Programme is an enhanced rural growth and resilience support service and a £2m rural capital Grant Investment Fund as well as a farming advisory service, helping Northumberland farmers to grow and diversify. 1.6 Amazon Launchpad Sustainability Accelerator

2. Communities, Charities, Not-for-Profit, Voluntary and Local Authorities

2.1 Newcastle Building Society Community Fund

Grants for community organisations for projects to improve the local community. The current round funds charities that tackle: work and opportunity; debt management; food poverty; homelessness; and the environment/sustainability. A maximum value of £5,000 is available, the application deadline is 1 April 2024. For further information click here.



2.2 Hadrian Trust (North East England)

Grants are available to help social welfare and charitable organisations working to improve the lives of people in the North East of England, particularly those working in the fields of social welfare, youth, disability, the elderly, women, ethnic minorities, education, arts and the environment. 2.3 Impetus Connect Fund - Youth Employment Grant

Unrestricted grant funding is available to UK registered charities and social enterprises in England and Wales that are supporting young people to prepare for and find work, with a particular focus on young people from ethnic minority backgrounds. 2.4 Veterans' Foundation

Grants are available for small and medium-sized charities and not-for-profit organisations that provide support to those in need among serving Armed Forces personnel, veterans, operationally qualified seafarers and their immediate families across the UK. 2.5 Thomas Wall Trust - Grants for Registered Charities

3. Arts, Culture, Heritage and Tourism

3.1 Music for All - Community Project Funding

Grants are available to UK-based community groups that aim to bring musical projects to their local communities. A discretionary amount is available, the application deadline is 1 April 2024. For further information <u>click here.</u>



3.2 Elephant Trust

Grants are available to artists, small organisations and galleries within the UK to make it possible for artists and those presenting their work to undertake and complete projects when frustrated by lack of funds. A maximum value of £5,000 is available, the application deadline is 7 April 2024. For further information click here.

3.3 Steel Charitable Trust

A fund to support businesses in England, Wales and Northern Ireland with high energy use to cut their bills and emissions through increased energy efficiency and transition to a low carbon future through the use of lower carbon energy and processes. 4.3 Worshipful Company of Information Technologists Charity

Grants are available for the development of innovative IT projects with a charitable or educational focus in the UK. A maximum value of £15,000 is available, the application deadline is 30 April 2024. For further information click here.

4.4 Waterloo Foundation - Environment Programme

Grant assistance for veterinary practitioners and clinical researchers in the UK for clinical research projects into diseases affecting companion animals. A maximum value of £20,000 is available, the application deadline is 15 May 2024. For further information click here.

5.3 Slurry Infrastructure Grant

A grant for farmers in England to improve or expand their slurry storage capacity to six months and improve the use of organic nutrients on farms. A maximum value of £250,000 is available, the application deadline is 28 June 2024. For further information click here.

6.1 Woodward Charitable Trust - Children's Summer Playscheme Grant
