	 a) Where you are complying with a demolition order made under the Housing Act 1957 b) For internal work in occupied buildings c) Small buildings with a volume of less than 1750 cubic feet d) Greenhouses, conservatories, sheds or prefabricated garages attached to a larger 			
	building			
	 e) Agricultural buildings 2. When can I start demolition work? 			
	Work must not start until you have submitted the notice, and either:			
	 a) You have received a letter of acceptance or a counter notice from us requiring certain work to be carried out as part of the demolition, or 			
	b) You have not heard from us within 6 weeks of serving the demolition notice on us. You are also advised to wait for replies from the persons you have sent copies of this notice to and to ensure that you have all other consents before starting work.			
	 3. Other Legislation Your proposals may be affected by other legislation such as Planning Permission, The Party Wall Act etc. Please ensure that you have all the appropriate consents before starting work. Advice on this can be provided. A Data Protection Act 1999
