SCHEDULE

Description of Conservation Area in the District of Hexham

The northern boundary commences at Haugh Lane and links through at its east end at the rear of Hallstile Cottages to the perimeter of the Wentworth Nurseries Car Park. From this point the line follows the west and south boundaries of the car park and along Hall Orchard Road to its junction with Station Road. It then runs south along Station Road and Priestpopple crossing Priestpopple at the junction with the Carlisle-Sunderland Trunk Road A.69 and running along the back of Argyle Terrace and thence westwards along the Ropery and through to Eastgate. From here it follows the footpath running westwards through to Gaprig Lane and Cuddy's Lane, and then along the rear of the properties on the south side of Hencotes to the junction with the Hexham-Langley Road B.6305. The boundary then takes in the grounds of West-acres and crossing Shaftoe Leazes just to the west of Burnside Cottages follows the Cockshaw Burn to a point just below Kingsgate from whence it runs north to the southern boundary of the Eilanville Estate and back on to Alexander Place and Haugh Lane.

Description of Conservation Area in the Urban District of Alnwick

The boundary of the Alnwick conservation area commences at the surrounds of Alnwick Castle and continues along the rear of properties fronting Bondgate Within and Bondgate Without (North), returning for a short distance up Prudhoe Street and thence along Dovecote Lane. The line then resumes its course along the rear of properties fronting Bondgate Without (South), Hotspur Street, Bondgate Within (South), and Market Street. A group of buildings at Tower Lane are then included

and the boundary passes eastwards down the centre line of Market Street to the 'bus station where it again resumes a course along the rear of properties fronting Fenkle Street. From the Almshouses and environs of Pottergate as far as the Pottergate Tower the boundary follows the rear of Bailiffgate and hence to include St. Michael's Church and yard, and continues down the west side of Canongate as far as No. 26. Crossing here the remaining part of the west of Canongate is included and the boundary returns to The Peth by the rear of properties fronting Canongate East and Walkergate South. Thence it returns to its commencement at the frontage of the castle.

A separate boundary includes an area of classical stone town houses, to the south of Green Batt. Commencing by including the east side of Percy Street (North) and all properties to the west of Howick Street (North), as far as Lisburn Street, it then follows the south facing frontage of Lisburn Street as far as No. 8 where it crosses the road to encompass both sides of Percy Terrace (south of Lisburn Street) and properties to the south of Prudhoe Street as far as Grey Place.
